Klamath County Historians Contribute To Pamphlet Case Report Impounded

Klamath County historians who wrote important contributions on

local history, played a part in compiling the information contained in "Oregon Historic Landmarks," thumbnail sketches of interesting buildings east of the Cascades, published by the Oregon Society, Daughters of the American Revolution.

Of the 30 illustrated articles, six were written by Buena Cobb Stone, Ida Momyer Odell and the late Edith McLeod. Mrs. Stone wrote on Fort Klamath, the O. T. Brown house on the Keno Highway and the Robert McLean house, still standing near Algoma. Mrs. Odell contributed the history of the Auntie Gowen home, now LaFiesta, a small Mexican restaurant on Pine Street near Klamath Valley Hospital, and Escudido Inn, on Highway 66 east of Klamath Falls, the home of Dr. and Mrs. O. E. Roenicke. Mrs. McLeod told the early history of the Linkville Hotel before Linkville was renamed Klamath Falls.

Mrs. Irene Foster, former Klamath Falls resident, now living in Dayton, was chairman in charge of contacting the contributing authors throughout Oregon. Mrs. Foster is a past regent of Eulalia Chapter DAR, Klamath Falls and served as registrar for 16 years.

Mrs. O. E. Roenicke is regent of Eulalia Chapter. The Oregon Society of DAR has previously published a brochure on the history of Oregon west of the Cascades.

NEW YORK (AP)—A General Sessions Court has ordered sealed the presentation of a grand jury after nearly nine months of inquiry into television quiz shows.

Judge Mitchell D. Schweitzer Wednesday sealed and impounded the report handed up to him by the jury foreman, Louis M. Hacker.

Schweitzer's only explanation was that his right to accept it had been challenged. He declined, however, to say who the challenging party was.

Hacker, former dean of the school of general studies at Columbia University, told Schweitzer in a prepared statement:

"We have written a report on a matter that has attracted universal attention. At the same time it is affected with a large public interest."

This is true for two reasons: First, charges of manipulation of quiz programs, have been made, in the course of which large sums as prizes were received by those who participated in these frauds. Obviously, moral questions affecting society, if not legal ones, are involved here.

"Secondly, we have been mindful of that fact that we are facing the whole nation and not only the people of the county of New York because the quiz programs that have originated here have had a national audience."
