STEPS TAKEN

PARIS (AP)—The National Assembly took initial steps today toward integration of revolt-torn Algeria with France.

The assembly adopted a bill allowing the French Parliament to approve Algeria's 1960 budget along with the French budget, and passed a measure making Algerian and French currency identical at the termination of fighting in the North African colony.

West Diplomats Concerned Over Latest French Trend

PARIS (AP)—France appears to be drawing steadily away from her chief partners in the Atlantic Alliance as President Charles de Gaulle puts on pressure to win his country an equal role with Britain and the United States.

Western diplomats are openly concerned over how far the stubborn French president will go.

De Gaulle has set a course aimed at restoring France to her lost international prestige and power. His strategy appears to be to cold shoulder various NATO projects until the United States and Britain openly recognize the "grandeur of France" which De Gaulle proclaims with religious fervor.

De Gaulle is asking to be accepted as a bargaining equal to President Eisenhower and British Prime Minister Harold Macmillan.

His demand is viewed as somewhat unrealistic since France has no atomic bomb, only two under-strength divisions now under NATO and is threatened with internal dissension over Algeria.

De Gaulle wants the formula on how to put together an A-bomb. He can't get it from the United States. Congress forbids that. Britain shows no inclination to give it to him.

The French president wants to work out with Eisenhower and Macmillan a global policy including the Middle East, Asia and Africa. But both the United States and Britain have misgivings about France's refusal to promise Algeria independence. The United States doesn't want its Far East policy decided in Paris. Britain is jealous of her role as senior partner to the United States in NATO.

There has been no indication the United States or Britain will give in on any major points. Yet they don't know how to placate De Gaulle otherwise. Reprisals would only raise the ire of the stiff-backed president.

The latest development is the prospect the supreme Allied commander, Gen. Lauris Norstad will soon pull some 200 American fighter-bombers away from French bases.

Norstad says that since France won't admit U.S.-controlled atomic weapons for the planes, they must be based where they can keep their ammunition.

Ultimatum Dispatched

PORTLAND (AP)—Employers have sent an ultimatum to return to work to Teamsters and Operating Engineers who have picketed sand, gravel and ready-mix concrete operations of Mid-Willamette Valley plants.

Pat Blair, manager of the Cascade Employers Assn., said Wednesday notices are in the mail. Last month Teamsters went on strike at one Corvallis plant. Employers retaliated by closing others in line with their stand that a strike against one is a strike against all.

Blair said in Eugene Wednesday night the ultimatum is designed to determine the legal status of workers on strike. "It will determine," he said, "their status in that employers will consider those who do not return to work as no longer employees."

Blair, who will be in Salem today, also announced that an unfair labor practices charge stemming from what employers consider a secondary boycott has been filed against the Salem Building Trades Council and its affiliated unions.

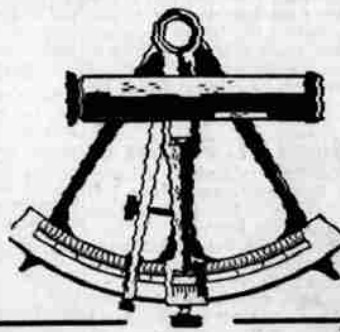

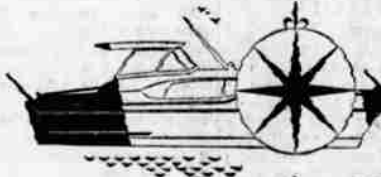
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
