NEW YORK (UPI) — Niagara Falls is running dry as one of the nation's foremost honeymoon spots, travel agents report.

Glamorous spots such as Bermuda, Las Vegas, Hawaii, Miami and the Virgin Islands are taking its place.

Of the more than 3 million persons who visited Niagara Falls last year, the Chamber of Commerce of Niagara Falls, N.Y., counted only a few more than 3,500 honeymoon couples.

William A. Doody, convention director of the chamber of commerce, said his home town had been rated the "honeymoon city" since the turn of the century. Historically, he said, it still stands as No. 1, in spite of a recent decline.

Travel agents who arrange accommodations for honeymooners and the honeymoon travel department of a magazine ("Modern Bride") put Bermuda, Pennsylvania resorts, New York City, Florida and Canada at the top of the wedding trip hit parade list.

The magazine's travel experts said the average honeymoon couple spends \$430 on its wedding trip. Only 7 per cent of all newlyweds do not go on honeymoons, they reported. The other 93 per cent take trips averaging 12 days, most of them in automobiles.

A Chicago tour director said that honeymooners who visit Niagara Falls these days usually just pass by on their way to another resort.

Sunburn May Come With First Picnic

A holiday is coming up. Let's go out into the country. It's been a long winter, but finally spring is here. Dad has the day off, the children don't have to go to school, let's have fun.

So the Pattersons make big plans. They will get up early, go to a wonderful place they know on the edge of a lake where the kids can play baseball.

"It will be too cold for swimming," warns mother.

"I'm going to take my swimming suit anyway," says Carol. "Just in case, besides, we can wade, it won't be too cold for that."

The day turns out warm and beautiful. The trip is a great success. The family comes home at night, tired, happy and with renewed family solidarity. But that night Carol wakes up crying. Mother goes into her room. The child is as red as a lobster, her body is hot and dry and she hurts all over.

The child has a severe case of sunburn, so severe that Mrs. Patterson is afraid to wait until morning to call the doctor. The doctor comes about 11 p.m. Carol is by then in a state of shock. She has to be taken to the hospital and treated as though she had been in a fire. She has second degree burns over her shoulders and back and first degree on her thighs and legs. She is in the hospital for two weeks.

She did wear her swimming suit. She had it on for hours all during the middle of the day. The warm sun had felt good on her winter-white skin. Neither she nor her mother realized what that pleasant warm sunshine was doing to the child.

Every Memorial Day this happens to hundreds, maybe thousands, of children.

It is not only that children's skins are winter-white in the early spring. It is that the sun's rays are much stronger than most people believe.

The sun is closest to the earth on June 21. It is on this day, at noon, that the sun is more powerful than at any other time in the whole year. Most people think of the hot sun of August as the strongest, but this is not the case. August sun has about the burning power of April sun.

You know that June 21 is the longest day in the year and so too the sun has its greatest burning power then. The days gradually lengthen in the spring and, by Memorial Day, while the maximum is not yet reached, the sun is very powerful, even though the temperature may not be very high.

The burning power of the sun goes along with the length of day, not with the temperature.

Early spring outings are fine, but skins need to be covered up, especially in the middle of the day.

It's a good rule to make children wear slacks and long-sleeved shirts from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. Let them get their sun before and after these hours and they will develop a tan without burning.
