Can't Sing, But Makes Hit Anyway

NEW YORK (UPI)—It was inevitable that Edd Byrnes should become a record artist with a hit disk.

He's the handsome young actor who has become very large with the teen-age set as one of the stars of the ABC-TV series "77 Sunset Strip." What makes him a natural for records is that, by his own admission, he can't sing.

"I don't know what it is," said the 25-year-old native New Yorker during a recent visit to his old haunts. "I sure can't sing. But all of a sudden, Warner Bros. wants me to make records for them. So I'm a singer."

His first side, "Kookie, Kookie," is based on Kookie, the bop-talking character he portrays in the weekly TV show. Edd feeds the rock 'n' roll set a big helping of rhyming bop lingo on the disk.

"They told me all I needed was a beat," explained the six-foot, brown-haired blue-eyed Adonis. "So we have the beat. But I'm still no singer."

Byrnes arrived in Hollywood in October, 1956, after working in summer stock and TV on the East Coast. In Hollywood, he appeared in a few westerns, "Cheyenne," "Jim Bowie" and "Darby's Rangers," before Warner signed him to a seven-year contract and added him to the "Sunset Strip" cast.

Unlike Kookie, Edd doesn't use much hip patter in his off-camera conversations. But, like Kookie, he is smitten by clothing or threads as the cool crowd refers to it, which is one reason Edd doesn't want to get involved in a TV western series.

"I'd enjoy doing a full-length cowboy picture, but not a western series for TV. I'd get tired of wearing the same clothes week after week."

Byrnes, who delivered ice, drove an ambulance, worked as a drill press operator in an aircraft factory and in a publishing house mail room before latching on to acting as a career, advises teenagers to join little theater groups if they want to act.

"This gives you good training. When the opportunity knocks, you will have the ability to make the most of it. I don't especially think acting schools can compare with the real thing," Edd said. "In summer stock, I did 10 plays in 10 weeks and that's the best kind of training, I think."

TV Names Winning Out
