

Canada Slated For Pay TV

LOS ANGELES (AP)—The president of International Tele-meter Co. says his firm will be operating pay TV in Canada before the end of the year.

Louis A. Novins said the paying viewer will be able to choose from a sports program, a motion picture or a local show at the same time. Coin boxes will be attached to the home sets.

The Canadian operation is under the name of Famous Players Canadian Corp. Ltd., headed by J. J. Fitzgibbons of Toronto. Novins said the system will be operated via the Canadian Bell Telephone Co.'s wire facilities.

Steel Strike Predicted

SEATTLE, Wash. (AP)—Secretary-Treasurer William Schnitzler of the AFL-CIO says a costly steel strike is inevitable next month.

Schnitzler is here to address the American Federation of Musicians convention.

He told newsmen Tuesday night: "The manner in which the steel companies have organized themselves against the welfare of their own workers makes a strike inevitable."

Schnitzler said President Eisenhower contributed to the deadlock in steel contract negotiations by warning that the United States cannot stand by and do nothing if wages and prices are pushed up in an inflationary spiral.

"The President said nothing about freezing profits," Schnitzler said, "only wages, prices and profits—everybody seems to have forgotten about the third word in this spiral talk."

Judge Orders Board To Submit Plan

ATLANTA (AP)—A federal judge has ordered the Atlanta Board of Education to submit a desegregation plan for the city's public schools within a reasonable time.

The ruling did not set any deadline. U.S. Dist. Judge Frank A. Hooper said he would allow sufficient time for the Georgia Legislature to act upon the plan if necessary.

The next regular session of the Legislature will be in January 1960. Mayor William B. Hartsfield of Atlanta said the ruling "allows time for both the city and the state to save the public schools."

In Washington, however, Sen. Richard Russell (D-Ga.) said he hoped the Atlantic school board would "use every means at their command to resist this effort... to enforce an abhorrent alien doctrine on a people who are proud of their belief in the right of the several states to control their local affairs."

In a written decision Tuesday, Hooper confirmed a ruling he made on June 5 and said he was compelled to enjoin racial discrimination in the Atlanta public schools.

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Flood Deals Heavy Blow To Commie Regime Plans

TOKYO (AP)—China's age-old week. Red broadcasts admit flood scourge is dealing a heavy blow to the Communist regime's plans to continue the "great leap forward" in 1959.

Torrential rains have been lashing south and central China for a week. Red broadcasts admit floods have inundated 900 square miles in Kwangtung province alone, but mobilization of some three million persons to combat the menace indicates the flooded area is much greater.

Peiping radio said harvesting of crops is going ahead normally in other sections of the vast country. But weather forecasts in Tokyo reported that the warm air front which brought the downpour to Kwangtung has moved toward the thickly settled lower Yangtze Valley.

The weathermen said a low pressure has developed over Hankow, Shanghai, Nanking and other east coast areas, and that they are due for a drenching.

The rains also have brought death and destruction to the adjacent British colony of Hong Kong. Tropical thunderstorms have killed 45 Chinese there, and 5,000 are homeless.

The Kwangtung rains were preceded by the heaviest rainstorm in 40 years in the Wuhan area of central China June 8. The Reds reported 4 to 6 inches of rain fell in a 14-hour period.

"Shock brigades of the communes camped right by the side of the farm land to carry on drainage work around the clock," one news account said.
