### Chief Reports Invade Threat

MANAGUA, Nicaragua (AP)—New invasion threats from two directions were reported Tuesday night by President Luis Somoza, whose government has just finished off a group of rebels that invaded Nicaragua two weeks ago. The 37-year-old president, whose family has ruled this Central American republic for 23 years, said one new set of invaders is based in Honduras and consists of about 50 men.

He was not certain whether it had actually crossed Nicaragua's northern border and sent units of his well trained army to check. The other group is getting ready to strike with about 200 men from neighboring Costa Rica, probably in about two weeks, Somoza said. He said the Honduras-based group is under the command of Rafael Somarriba, a Nicaraguan National Guard lieutenant 10 years ago. Somoza charged it was formed and trained in Cuba of mercenaries from several Caribbean countries.

He claimed both groups contain members of the Caribbean Legion, an outfit purportedly dedicated to the overthrow of dictatorships. The contingent in Honduras, he charged, is financed by Communists and armed by Prime Minister Fidel Castro's government.

### Compromise Housing Bill Backed By Demo Leaders

WASHINGTON (AP)—Democratic leaders backed today a compromise \$1,310,000,000 housing bill pruned sharply to avoid a budget-busting tag and a possible presidential veto.

Although a Senate-House conference committee has yet to work out final details, House Speaker Sam Rayburn (D-Tex.) and Senate Majority Leader Lyndon B. Johnson of Texas passed the word they want a measure limited to a two-year program and tailored to stay within Eisenhower's new budget.

This would follow the pattern of an airport aid program cut below Eisenhower's monetary requests and cropped to two years. It is in line with the Rayburn-Johnson argument that more ambitious programs can await what they profess to regard as the certain election of a Democratic president in 1960.

Rayburn and Johnson apparently are determined to shoot out from under the Republicans the main stays of the GOP campaign to label the Democrats as spenders. The housing and airport aid bills have been frequently cited in GOP attacks on the "budget-busters."

With this in mind, Sen. John Sparkman (D-Ala.) predicted that when the housing measure is compromised in final form it will be nearly veto-proof.

"We're going to make it very difficult for the President to veto it, I believe in a housing program at all," Sparkman said.

Sparkman added that the bill will make almost no change on the budget totals recommended by Eisenhower for the coming year. It apparently is going to take some legislative sleight-of-hand, however, to telescope the program into two years. As a part of the omnibus measure, the Senate voted for a six-year outlay of \$2,100,000,000 for urban renewal. The House approved a three-year program of 1 1/2 billion. Eisenhower had asked \$1,350,000,000 over a six-year period.

Ordinarily, the Senate-House compromise committee has to stay within the time and money limit of the House and Senate versions of the bills. But members were said to have obtained a ruling from the House parliamentarian that will permit them to confine the urban program to two years and limit its expenditures to 900 million dollars.

In an obvious move to reduce the over-all total of the compromise bill, the Senate plucked out of it and passed as separate legis-

lation Tuesday a 100-million-dollar authorization for direct housing loans to veterans. It included a provision to raise interest rates on veterans' mortgages from 4 1/4 per cent to 5 1/4 per cent, as asked by the administration.
