Challenger Holds Back?

GROSSINGER, N.Y. (AP)—Is Ingemar Johansson a bug or is he holding back in training?

The chances are the question won't be answered until the night of June 25 when the Swedish challenger steps into the ring against world heavyweight champion Floyd Patterson at Yankee Stadium in New York.

His workout Wednesday was a typical one for the solidly built 26-year-old from Goteborg. He showed a snappy, sometimes stiff left jab against three regular sparring partners and his brother, middleweight Rolf. The touted right hand again was used sparingly and once more without power.

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Pete Newell Price Quoted

OAKLAND, Calif. (AP)—An Oakland sportscaster says Pete Newell, coach of California's national champion basketball team, has been offered about \$15,500 a year to go to the University of Washington.

Bud Foster, of Station KTVU-TV, made the statement Wednesday night. The amount of Newell's salary at California has not been hinted. At Washington he would succeed Tippy Dye, who has resigned after nine years to become athletic director at Wichita University, in Kansas.

Foster also said California's athletic chiefs had held a top secret meeting last Friday to discuss the overall coaching situation. School officials will also meet Friday at Los Angeles, Foster added.

None of California's leading coaches, including Pete Elliott in football, is happy because of an administrative situation, Foster said. Previously he had said that although both UCLA and California have joint administration, UCLA is favored.

Earlier Wednesday, Newell was quoted by the Seattle Times as saying "my problems at California either will be resolved, or they won't be by Friday."

Washington's Athletic Director George Briggs is a longtime friend of Newell's.

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Cubans Hail New 'Gavilan'

MIAMI BEACH, Fla. (AP)—Cubans in the Miami area today hailed what they called "the new Kid Gavilan" in the person of Luis Manuel Rodriguez, a lanky, fast-punching youngster from Camaguey.

Rodriguez soundly whipped former Welterweight Champion Virgil Akins of St. Louis in a 10-round nationally televised fight Wednesday night and made a solid impression in his first appearance in this country.

Kid Gavilan ruled the welterweight division from 1952 to 1954, and Rodriguez, 22 years old, hopes to follow in his footsteps. The young Cuban is unbeaten in 22 fights and operates much on the order of the speedy Gavilan.

Using a flurry of left jabs and right hooks, Rodriguez won all but a couple of rounds in the

opinion of Referee Cy Gottfried and two ringside judges.

Although there were no knockdowns, Akins was a tired and beaten man at the end, while Rodriguez was still throwing stinging punches that had closed the former champion's left eye.

Akins won the title June 6, 1958, and lost it to Don Jordan in Los Angeles Dec. 5.

Eddie Yawitz, St. Louis druggist and manager of Akins, was boiling mad over the outcome of the Rodriguez fight.
