Trial Plea Won By Con

SAN DIEGO, Calif. (UPI)—Luis Cervantes, 52, studied enough law while serving a prison term to win a new trial.

Cervantes, of San Diego, was convicted in 1956 of importing and concealing narcotics and was sentenced to eight years in prison. He had been arrested at San Clemente, Calif., in 1955 by immigration officers who said they found heroin and marijuana in his car.

Cervantes did his studying at McNeil Island Penitentiary, Wash., and won his new trial on grounds the government failed to show the alleged contraband was seized legally.

Under the ruling granting him a retrial, the government must bring a witness from Bellingham, Wash., subpoena witnesses for Cervantes and give him a jury trial which he previously waived.

Florida Chief Vetoes Bill

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP)—Gov. Leroy Collins has vetoed the bill to set aside \$500,000 for presenting the South's racial philosophies to the rest of the nation in a paid publicity campaign.

"Although the plan purports to seek understanding for the South, in my judgment its effects could be to create even more misunderstanding," Collins said in his veto message Wednesday.

The bill would have authorized the expenditure only if four other Southern states came in on the publicity campaign with similar amounts.

Solons Want To Be Sure Planes Will Be Armed

WASHINGTON (AP)—Senators set out today to make it as certain as possible that American patrol planes fly with guns loaded and in working order in the future. Sen. Styles Bridges (R-NH) joined Sen. Lyndon B. Johnson (D-Tex.) in a demand that steps be taken to see to it that no American plane again is as defenseless as the converted Navy antisubmarine plane strafed by Communist MIG fighters over the Sea of Japan.

"Our planes should be fully armed and have their guns ready to fire if they are attacked," Bridges said. "We are going to investigate this situation and what can be done about making certain that our men can fight back immediately if they are fired on."

Bridges, chairman of the Senate Republican Policy Committee, and Johnson, the Senate Democratic leader, are top members of

Mrs. Guerrero was using the plastic as a liner for the child's mattress.

Navy airmen said Wednesday that a communications mishap and two useless gun mounts in their patrol plane had left them at the mercy of the Communist fighters when their one operative gun in the tail assembly was knocked out. The tail gunner was wounded before he could fire a shot.

Adm. Wallace M. Beakley told a Senate hearing Wednesday that all naval planes are under orders to return any attack. Beakley, deputy chief of naval operations, said the attacked plane did not

return the fire because its tail guns were shot out. There was temporary disagreement over why other guns in the fore part of the plane and atop its fuselage were not working.

The plane's pilot told newsmen in Japan that needed spare parts for these two turrets hadn't arrived in time.

But the Defense Department said the forward turret had been purposely taken out of commission and the other removed to make way for special reconnaissance equipment, presumably radar or camera devices.

After the Washington announcement U.S. naval headquarters in Japan put out a statement saying that "the bow (forward) turret had partially been replaced by special detection equipment." It did not elaborate further.

But even if the forward guns had been working, they would have been of no use against the fighters, the Navy said.

In a report to Chairman Richard B. Russell (D-Ga.) of the Senate Armed Services Committee, it said the forward guns in the slow patrol plane "are for the purpose of straining submarines on the surface and are of no value against fighter aircraft."

Johnson said the fact that members of the crew were unable to defend themselves must be explored thoroughly.

"It seems incredible that equipment which should be elementary in any military plane exposed to such hazards should be missing," he said. "Americans will insist only that the facts be brought to light but that we have strong assurances that our men will not again be defenseless."

NEW YORK (AP)—Her eyes seared by lye hurled by a mysterious assailant, a bride-to-be faces delicate surgery today in an attempt to save the sight of one eye.

Dr. Milton Berliner, eye specialist, said Wednesday night regarding the condition of 22-year-old Linda Riss: "The right eye is hopeless. The left eye is badly damaged."

Linda had become engaged last Sunday. Monday morning, before she left for her job in a textile office, the apartment doorbell rang.

A Negro man told the girl's mother, Mrs. Bertha Riss, 55: "I have a present for Linda."
