Yosemite Fall Kills LA Lad

YOSEMITE NATIONAL PARK, Calif. (UPI) — A 16-year-old Los Angeles boy was killed Monday night when he fell from a rock above Camp Curry after saying he was "going to watch the firefall."

Park rangers reported Bobby Trion apparently died when he fell 100 feet from a sheer rock about 500 feet above the valley floor. They estimated he died around 9:30 p.m. but his body was not found until about 1 a.m. by searchers.

The search was started after an aunt, Mrs. Thomas Connelly of Los Angeles, reported Bobby had told her son, Walter, three hours earlier he was going to climb the cliff. Rangers said they received reports about 9:30 someone was calling "help I can't get down" from the rocks but were unable to make verbal contact.
