Grand Jury To Mull Case

PORTLAND (AP)—Three Portland residents, accused of being accomplices in a Stockton, Calif., bank robbery, Monday were ordered removed to Stockton for trial.

U.S. Commissioner Claire Mundorf said the cases of Marie Anita Bekins, 19; Kathleen Rae McLean, 14; and Gilbert Duwayne Layman, then would be considered by a federal grand jury there.

The three are charged in federal warrants with being accomplices in the June 9 robbery, in which \$300 was taken from the Wilson Way Branch of the Bank of America in Stockton.

Richard Wendell Holt is being held in Stockton on a bank robbery charge, the FBI here reported.

An attorney for the two women said he may appeal Mrs. Mundorf's ruling to the U.S. District Court here.

The three Portland residents are being held in the Multnomah County Jail in lieu of \$3,000 bail apiece.

Warning Issued In China Flood

TOKYO (AP)—Red China warned the millions of Chinese living in the Canton area of Kwangtung province that raging flood crests on the swollen North and West rivers will strike there Wednesday.

The Communists already have said the floods in Kwangtung may be the worst of the century. The damage is expected to deal a sharp blow to Red economic hopes this year.

Police Seek Two Seamen

ST. JOHNS, Nfld. (AP)—Police today hunted two young seamen who jumped ship from the Soviet trawler Neman. One report said \$1,500 was missing from the ship.

Victor Selianoff, second secretary of the Soviet Embassy in Ottawa, came to St. Johns to investigate the disappearance of the seaman after the Neman docked here Sunday.

The missing men were identified as Vilnis Butolds and Adolph Thoms, both 21.

The Neman acts as a factory ship for the Soviet trawler fleet on the Grand Banks. She put in here for provisions.

Canada Aides View Dike

PORTLAND (AP)—Three representatives of the Canadian Navy came to town Monday to look at a damaged dike on Suavies Island.

It was reported earlier that the damage was caused from waves set up by a flotilla of Canadian destroyer-escorts that steamed too briskly up the Columbia River.

The ships came here on a goodwill visit to take part in Portland's annual Rose Festival.

Taking a look at the damaged dike Monday were Capt. G. Ross Turner of Victoria, B. C.; Robert Goss of Vancouver, B.C., representing an insurance firm; and Will Pegusch of Vancouver, B.C., an engineer.

After an inspection conducted by the U.S. Corps of Engineers, everyone decided the river was too high to get a proper look at the damage.

The U.S. engineers said another inspection will be made when the level of the river falls.
