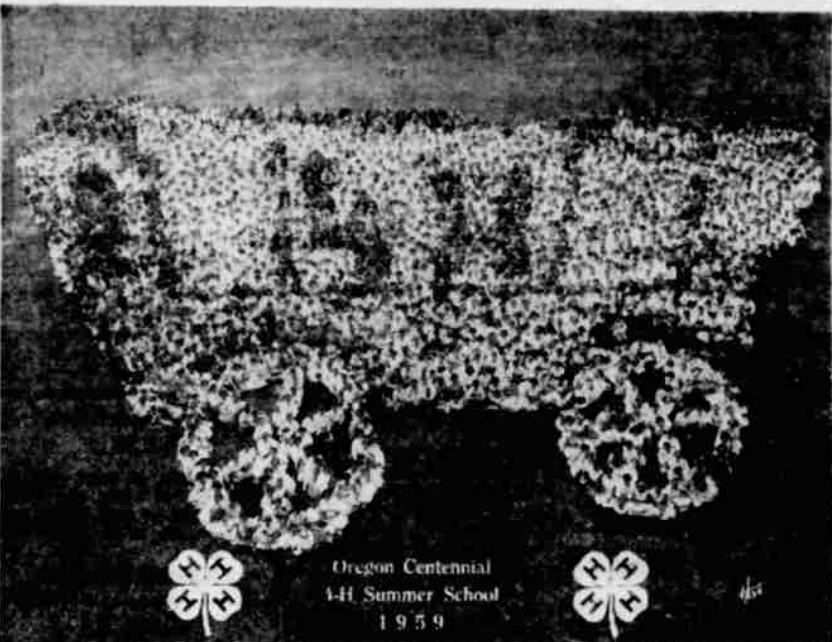

Pursuant to O.R.S. 36.223, notice is hereby given of a hearing on an Application For Contract Forest Road submitted to the County Court for the County of Klamath, by Weyerhaeuser Timber Company, which said application was filed with the Klamath County Clerk on June 3, 1959, covering the improvement and maintenance of the following roads in Klamath County, Oregon:

A. That certain road sometimes known as the Fishhole Road, beginning at State Highway No. 66 and thence extending in a generally southeasterly direction for a distance of approximately 1 1/2 miles, and terminating at the county line between Klamath and Lake counties, all of said road being within the Big Ranger District, County of Klamath, State of Oregon, and designated as United States Forest Service Road No. 379.

B. That certain road sometimes known as the Campbell Market Road, beginning at State Highway No. 66 and thence extending in a generally northerly direction for a distance of approximately 2 miles, and terminating at the junction with United States Forest Service Road No. 3661, sometimes known as the Finner Coral Road.

Said application further covers the following proposed for improvement and maintenance:

A. Widening and extending existing turnouts and adding new ones as necessary, all turnouts to be 26 feet wide for 100 feet.

C. Reinforcing two Fishhole Bridges, as specified by the Forest Service.

D. Surface where required and as per agreement with the above-entitled court and the United States Forest Service.

E. Maintenance of proper drainage.

F. Maintenance of wear, surface, and replacement of ballast as displaced by use.

G. Application of effective dust palliatives during the dry season.

H. At end of season, road will be left in good condition including, but not limited to, open culverts and cattle guards repaired.

Said hearing shall be held in the County Court office, Klamath County Court House, Klamath Falls, Oregon, on July 10, 1959, at the hour of 10:00 a.m. All persons interested may appear and be heard for or against said application.
