

# French Claim Port City

ALGIERS (AP)—The French army claimed complete control again today around the eastern port city of Bone after crushing the largest rebel assault ever made on a big Algerian city. The rebels' aim appeared to be psychological rather than military.

French troops, planes and tanks surrounded the rebel band on the outskirts of Bone near the airport. A communique reported 31 rebels killed and 15 captured during more than 12 hours of fighting Wednesday. The French reported six of their soldiers killed.

Prisoners said the band had been dispatched as reinforcements to the Kabylie mountain area in central Algeria from nearby Tunisia, where the rebels have their main training ground.

The Algerian attackers were specially uniformed and equipped with automatic weapons. In attacking the heavily fortified city of 150,000, they apparently were trying to show the world, the French and their own people that the 4½-year-old rebellion is still flourishing despite French claims to the contrary.

# Argentina Near Revolution As President Fights Rebs

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina (AP)—Argentina seemed near the brink of revolution today, with President Arturo Frondizi beset by continuing rebelliousness in military circles and the threat of mass protests by Communist and Peronist labor unions.

Government officials continued to claim that the threat to the government had been averted by Frondizi's reshuffle of his cabinet and particularly by the appointment of a leading advocate of free enterprise, Alvaro Alsogaray, to head the economic and labor ministries.

Other sources said certain high military leaders were far from satisfied and sentiment in favor of ousting Frondizi was still strong in the armed forces.

War Secretary Hector Solanas Pacheo admitted that a number of army officers for whom arrest warrants had been issued were still at large. Many were believed in the military barracks at Cordoba, the center of current agitation against Frondizi and the starting point of the 1955 revolution which overthrew Dictator Juan Peron.

Vice Adm. Isaac Rojas, a leader of the anti-Peron revolt, predicted Wednesday that Frondizi would face a revolution "within a few days or a few weeks" if he did not resign immediately.

The 62 labor unions known for their Peronist sympathies issued a communique accusing Frondizi of failing to keep his campaign promises and blaming him for "errors which have brought the country to the verge of chaos."

Alsogaray's appointment as the country's economic and labor czar was certain to increase the unions' opposition to Frondizi.

Although Alsogaray was reported planning the ouster of a number of Peronists still in the government, it was feared the disgruntled officers would not be pacified.

Gen. Pedro Aramburu, the provisional president until Frondizi was inaugurated 14 months ago, denounced any military coup d'etat, but said the crisis was caused by "fraud and corruption."

Aramburu, who is visiting in West Germany, named no names.
