



Chief Signs Lease Bill

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Eisenhower has signed a bill permitting state and county agencies to lease O&C and Coos Bay Wagon Road Grant lands in Oregon for recreational use.

Under the law, the Secretary of Interior may grant 20-year leases with renewal privileges to the state and its political subdivisions.

Another bill signed by the President adds 320 acres of acquired land to the O&C acreage. The land was deeded to the government by the E. K. Wood Lumber Co. in partial settlement of a claim for timber damage in a 1951 forest fire.

Heart Ailment Fatal To Youth

LIBERAL, Kan. (AP)—Twelve-year-old James Arnold's heart stopped Tuesday while a physician was sewing up his foot, cut in a lawn mower accident.

Dr. T. E. Wade opened the boy's chest and massaged the heart for 90 minutes until its action was restored. It failed to save James' life, however. He died Wednesday afternoon.

The boy was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Orbin Arnold who live near Tyrone, Okla. Dr. Wade said a heart ailment caused the boy's collapse while he was being treated.

WARRENTON, Ore. (AP)—Governor Mark Hatfield was unable to attend the Governors Day Parade by the Oregon National Guard at Camp Rilea Wednesday.

The governor's wife is due to have a baby soon and he wanted to be with her.

The parade was held anyway and the camp was formally named Camp Rilea in honor of the late Maj. Gen. Thomas E. Rilea, who was Oregon adjutant general for 17 years until his death last February.

The site has been known as Camp Clatsop in past years.

Brig. Gen. Alfred E. Hintz, the new state adjutant general, said the 1,200 members of the headquarters troops of the Oregon National Guard would continue to train at the camp each summer. It is the only active duty training post in Oregon.

Theft Attempted Of Wrong Horse

DETROIT, Mich. (AP)—Paul Vernon, 29, felt a powerful urge to take a horseback ride. But he picked the wrong steed.

Spotting a horse standing with empty saddle on a downtown street, Vernon leaped on its back and went cantering off.

But before you could say "he went that-a-way" the regular rider, Policeman Edwin Waddell, burst from a lunchroom and collared Vernon as he went clomping down an alley.

Vernon was charged with being intoxicated.

Trouble Said No Stranger To Man Held For Killing

YAKIMA, Wash. (AP)—Trouble is no stranger to John Bernard Doyle, who fled a mental hospital on his 22nd birthday and is now charged with the slaying of a man he didn't know.

Doyle was bound over Wednesday to U. S. District Court for Eastern Washington. He was arrested Tuesday night near Cle Elum in the parked car of Vivian Meagher, 56, Seattle.

Earlier that day, Meagher's body was found on the Yakima Indian Reservation about 45 miles southwest of Yakima. He had been shot twice.

Doyle fled Northern State Hospital in Sedro Woolley June 9. He broke away and outran attendants who were escorting him from the maximum security ward to another building.

Dr. Charles H. Jones, Northern State Hospital superintendent, said Wednesday psychiatrists there did not consider Doyle violent or dangerous.

Doyle first came under psychiatric care after he shot himself in
