

### Podbielan Lifts San Diego Padres Into Third

Brilliant pitching by Bud Podbielan lifted San Diego into third place in the Pacific Coast League Sunday night as the Padres downed Vancouver, 6-1.

Winning his seventh game in a row, Podbielan allowed four hits in the contest at Vancouver. One was a homer by Ron Hansen.

It was Podbielan's second start since returning from the parent Cleveland Indians. He struck out two and walked only one member of the second-place Mounties.

League-leading Sacramento won both ends of a doubleheader at Portland, 2-1 and 1-0. Seattle and Phoenix split one at Seattle, the Giants winning the opener 7-2 and

the Rainiers taking the final game 5-4.

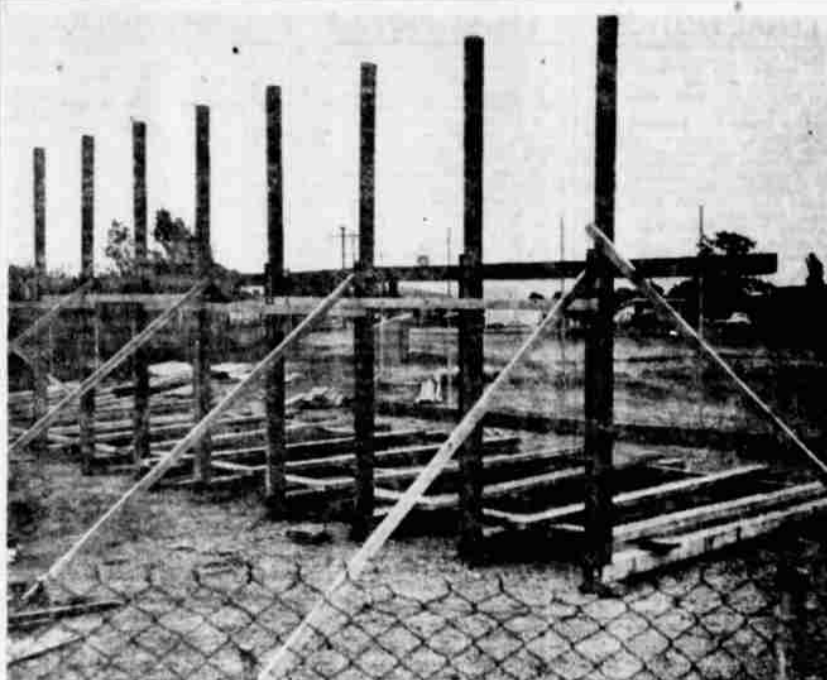
### Weed Edges SV In Extra Innings

**Boxing Champ Denies Report**  
NEW YORK (AP) — Ingemar Johansson, the new heavyweight boxing champion of the world, denied a Swedish report today that he planned to retire after two more fights.

"I expect to keep fighting for the next 10 years," the 26-year-old Swede said shortly before departing by air for a Florida vacation.

In Göteborg, Dr. Gosta Karlsson, Johansson's personal physician and adviser, said upon arriving from New York that the champion would limit himself to two title defenses and then quit.

Johansson does not wish to risk serious ring injury, the doctor added.

But Johansson quickly spiked retirement talk.

"Why should I stop now that I am on top," he told The Associated Press. "That statement in Göteborg is all wrong. I'll keep fighting for the next 10 years at least."

"I cannot understand why that statement was made," the champion said, referring to Karlsson's comments.
