Seven Die In Accidents

The first full weekend of summer claimed a high accident toll in Oregon. Three persons died in the state in traffic, drowning and gunshot accidents. Four Oregonians were killed in accidents in other states.

Herbert Eugene Sample, 21, of McNary, Ariz., died Sunday at a Gold Beach hospital from a gunshot wound in the chest which police said was inflicted while he and another man were practicing fast draws with what they thought were unloaded guns.

The other man, John Lopez Durran, also of Arizona, was being held in jail at Gold Beach pending a coroner's inquest.

Karen Perrigo, 13, of Portland, drowned at Cannon Beach Saturday when she and a companion were swept into a deep hole by a wave. The other girl was rescued.

Six-year-old Brian Barney of The Dalles, died in a hospital Saturday from injuries suffered in a traffic accident the day before.

Airman Z.C. Virgil McDougall, 20, of Eugene was one of four persons killed Sunday in a head-on automobile collision near Mountain Home Air Force Base in southwestern Idaho.

Two Portland men, Robert McNeill Brown, 42, and Don G. Hug, 32, were drowned after a big rubber raft hit a log and spilled them into the Cowlitz River near Chehalis, Wash., Sunday.

Gary Leroy Miller, 22, of Aloha, Ore., was killed in a racing car accident at Bremerton, Wash. His car left the track on a curve and smashed into a tree. It was Miller's first race on a dirt track.

Gas Tax Hike Set By Solon

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Richard L. Neuberger (D-Ore.) plans to introduce an amendment to increase federal gasoline taxes by 1½ cents when the next revenue bill comes before the Senate.

Neuberger said such legislation is necessary or many states—including Oregon—may have to suspend the letting of road-building contracts.

Last Thursday the Senate turned down an amendment which would have increased gasoline taxes from 3 cents to 4½ cents.

Neuberger said Saturday: "The issue posed by the amendment still remains. Will the interstate highway program be financed on a pay-as-you-go basis through user taxes or will it be with deficit financing, which means huge sums wasted in higher interest rates on the debt?"

Crash Victim Back Home

SHELBYVILLE, Ill. (AP)—Six weeks have elapsed since Ivan Moon, sole survivor of a crash in which seven died, danced with his betrothed, Dorothy Thomas, for the last time.

The dance was the last for Dorothy, 18, and for six other young persons, including Ivan's sister, who crowded into his auto and headed off after the Shelbyville High School prom.

The final tune of the gay evening was "Memento to Remember."

Ivan can't forget.

A shattering collision with a train at a crossing near Mattoon killed six of the young people outright. The seventh died in a hospital hours later.

Ivan, 22, lay in a Mattoon hospital for days before he recovered sufficiently to be told of the tragedy.

Three weeks later he was released from the hospital.

He has returned to his home and his job as a mechanic—trying to resume as best he can the life he knew before the night of May 18,
