## Ingemar Interested By Joe Louis Story

NEW YORK (AP) — Ingemar Johansson says he first became interested in boxing when he was 13.

"I read about Joe Louis and I see that he is a big man and getting everything," said the new heavyweight champion.

When he was 15 he started boxing in amateur competition. He left school at the same time.

"I didn't like school. Some of the teachers didn't like me," he added.

One of six children of a stone-cutter and laborer, Ingemar went to work on construction gangs and on the docks. This physical labor hardened his body and broadened his shoulders.

"I had about 86 amateur fights," he said. "I win almost all of them and the Swedish championship. After the Olympics, I felt I was ready to fight the professionals."

Johansson won 11 straight pro fights, six of them by knockouts, through the summer of 1955. He was beginning to create a stir in Scandinavian countries.

On Aug. 28, 1955, Johansson knocked out Hein Ten Hoff, Germany's fading European champion, in the first round. He was ready for faster competition.

He came to the U.S. to take a look at American fighters after the Ten Hoff slaughter. Ingo visited famed Stillman's Gym. He looked at the American style of fighting, did some sparring, and returned to his native land.

"I could see I was not ready yet for this kind of competition," he said.

In 1956 he stopped European champion Franco Cavicchi of Italy at Bologna, Italy in 13 rounds.

On Feb. 21, 1958, Johansson defended his European title against Welshman Joe Erskine, the British champion who was virtually set for a title fight in America with world champion Floyd Patterson.

Johansson stopped Erskine in the 13th round.

Five months later Johansson knocked out Germany's Heinz Neuhaus in the fourth round.

"He knew he was ready for the best now," said Edwin Ahlquist, Johansson's adviser.

Eddie Machen, the undefeated No. 1 contender from California, was imported.

For the first minute Johansson backed away from Machen. Suddenly Ingo's right shot out, crashing against Machen's temple. The Californian crumpled to the canvas at 1:13. He staggered to his feet but Johansson stormed after him. It was all over in 136 seconds.

The mighty upset startled the boxing world. Johansson became the No. 1 contender with a 21-0 record, including 13 knockouts. He was matched with Patterson after prolonged, secret negotiations.

## Bookies Pick Floyd Victor In Rematch

 NEW YORK (AP) — Broadway bookmakers apparently doubt whether freshly crowned heavyweight champion Ingemar Johansson of Sweden can flash his thunder and lightning right against Floyd Patterson in their return bout.

The bookies have made the blitzed Patterson a 7-5 choice over the Goteborg gunner.

In setting this early line, the bookies have displayed a lot more boldness than a lot of still smarting, red-faced "experts"—especially the writer.

But on the basis of the information I had and what I had seen, I feel my pick was justified. I predicted it would be an explosive, bloody battle. I said there was a possibility that Patterson might get nailed but I said I didn't think it would happen.

I had plenty of company, too. In the AP poll of the "experts" 63 of 69 picked Patterson, mostly by a kavo. Four of the seven Swedish writers polled picked Patterson. Presumably they had seen Johansson in pro action.

## Al Cantello, Gutowski Get Beaten

HELSINKI, Finland (UPI) — American world record-holders Bob Gutowski and Al Cantello were outclassed Tuesday in the concluding events of a two-day international track and field meet.

Gutowski, of La Jolla, Calif., failed to attain his usual 15-foot-plus leap in the pole vault as European champion Eeles Landsgroem of Finland won the event at 14 feet, 9 1/2 inches. Gutowski, who has an accepted world mark of 15 feet, 8 1/2 inches, could do no better than 14 feet, 5 1/2 inches.

Al Cantello of the U. S. Marines finished a poor third to Michel Macquet of France who turned in a winning 256 feet, 8 1/2 inches in the javelin throw. Cantello, with a toss of 240 feet, 5 1/2 inches, was far short of his world mark of 282 feet, 3 1/2 inches.
