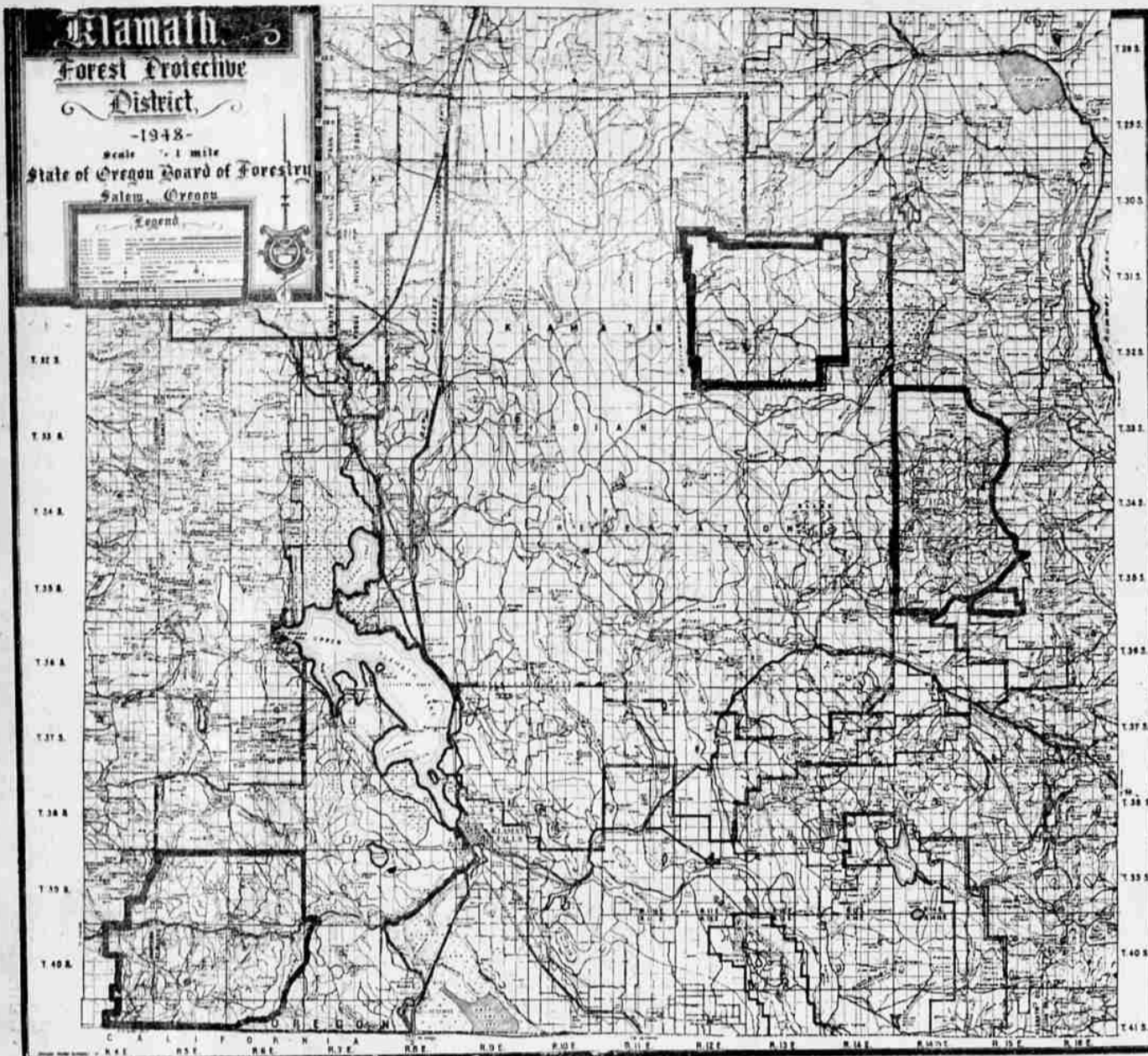


Fire Closures



PROCLAMATION Southwesterly along the South side of the river to the West line of Sec. 31; thence South to the point of beginning.

Permits to enter the above area may be obtained at the following places:

Klamath Forest Protective Association Headquarters, Klamath Falls, Oregon
Bly Guard Station, Bly, Oregon

AREA NO. 10 - P - KLAMATH ASSOCIATION - Green Springs Area:
Beginning on Jackson County line at Northwest corner of T. 39 S., R. 5 E.; thence East 12 miles; thence South 6 miles; thence East 3/4 mile to Topsy Grade Road; thence Southwesterly on Topsy Grade Road to California line; thence West on State line to Jenny Creek; thence North on Jenny Creek to its convergence

with Johnson Creek; thence North on Johnson Creek to Jackson-Klamath County line; thence North to point of beginning, except the right-of-way of Ashland-Klamath Falls highway, the Copco Road from White Star to the California state line and the Clover Creek Road to Lake O' The Woods for through travel.

AREA NO. 12-P - KLAMATH ASSOCIATION - Yamsey Mt. Area:
All lands included in area bounded by a line beginning at a point at the Northeast corner of the NE 1/4 Section 6, T. 31 S., R. 11 E.; thence South 1 mile, East 1/2 mile, South 2 1/2 miles, East 1/4 mile, South 6 1/2 miles, East 1/4 mile, South 2 miles to the point of beginning.

Permits to enter the above area require the entrant:

- (1) To refrain from smoking except in places designated as safe in said permit.
- (2) To build no open fires except in places designated as safe in said permit.
- (3) To have as equipment when using campfires, except when traveling as a pedestrian or camping at improved, designated and posted campgrounds, tools specified by the forester as suitable for extinguishing fires.

This Proclamation shall be effective from and after the 30th day of June, 1959, and shall remain in full force and effect until the 31st day of December, 1959.

LAVA HOT SPRINGS, Idaho (AP) — The Oregon Centennial wagon train pushes on to this Southeast Idaho town today.

The 11-mile journey to here from the train's overnight campsite on a backwoods trail will be one of the shortest daily trips on the cavalcade's 2,000-mile-plus trek.

The journey from Independence, Mo., to Independence, Ore., is a highlight of Oregon's Centennial celebration.

Thursday morning, the train plans to head for Pocatello, 34 miles away, and arrive Friday to set off the city's Frontier Days rodeo celebration.

The train will stay in Pocatello until after the July 4 weekend to avoid heavy holiday traffic on the highways.
