

New Circus World Museum To Open At Ringling Home

BARABOO, Wis. (AP)—The new Circus World Museum opens its doors today in the home of the Ringling Brothers with all the fanfare that formerly surrounded the halycon days when the "Greatest Show on Earth" came to town.

Circus Day, proclaimed by the Wisconsin Legislature, included a gala parade with elephants, bands, a steam calliope, floats and circus wagons once used by the Ringlings and official opening of the new museum.

The museum, festooned with brilliantly-colored banners depicting the freaks and curiosities of the old midway, occupies two large Ringling buildings that once housed horses and camels when the circus had its winter quarters here.

Reconstructed famous old circus wagons and floats, a \$50,000 miniature circus built to scale of the Ringling colossus when it traveled on four trains, and other authentic items of circus paraphernalia, are on display. There also

is a regular circus tent that is occupied by Blanche, a 4,000 pound Indian elephant and other animals.

Movie actress Rhonda Fleming, one of the stars of the movie "The Big Circus" was scheduled to ride in the parade, perched atop the head of one of the elephants.

Mrs. Fleming will appear at the Ringling and Julliard Theaters in the evening for the world premier of "The Big Circus." Proceeds of the showings will go to the museum.

The festivities were scheduled near the yard of the Baraboo jail where in November, 1882, Al. All T., Otto, John, and Charles Ringling and others staged the first performance of the "Ringling Classic and Comic Concert Company" with a display of dogs, cats and stuffed squirrels. The Ringling Brothers later joined Yankee Robinson to form Yankee Robins and Ringling Bros. Circus which opened at Baraboo May 19, 1884.

The circus expanded to become the ruler of the outdoor show world.

First Federal Ups Dividend

The directors of First Federal Savings and Loan Association today announced an increase in the dividend rate.

The association will distribute a dividend to its savings customers on December 31 this year on the basis of four per cent per annum, according to an announcement by George W. McIntyre, First Federal's president.

"The additional one-half per cent is declared as part of the association's observance of its 23rd anniversary," McIntyre said. "The directors are very pleased to announce the increase in rate at this time," he added.

When the association was established in August, 1934, the dividend rate was on a four per cent basis, McIntyre recalls. Since that time, it has varied from two to three and one-half per cent over the years.

Dividends paid to savers for the six months ending June 30 this year were in excess of \$285,000. "This is quite a contrast," McIntyre commented, "to the total dividends of \$29,92 paid in December, 1934."

Court Orders New Trial

SALEM (AP)—The state Supreme Court today ordered a new trial for a land condemnation case in Klamath County.

The court reversed a judgment of \$13,250 won in Klamath County Circuit Court from the Highway Department by Mr. and Mrs. A. W. Arnold, Maude Liskay and Tootsie Wyman Jean Liskay.

The suit involved reserved mineral rights in a cinder cone near Chiloquin. The Highway Commission had asserted the value was \$100.

The opinion was by Justice Kenneth O'Connell.

VA Seeking Librarians

Approximately 50 librarians are needed in Veterans Administration Installations located throughout the United States (except in Alaska and Hawaii) and Puerto Rico, the United States Civil Service Commission announces. The vacancies are in patients' libraries and medical record libraries, and pay entrance salaries of \$4,960 a year.

To qualify, applicants must have completed a full college course which included at least 24 semester hours in library science. In addition, they must have had one year of experience as a librarian or one year of graduate study in library science.

C. Applications will be accepted until further notice.

Hearings Scheduled

Public hearings will be held by the Small Business Administration in Portland, August 26 and 27, on procedures covering sales of government-owned timber set aside for exclusive competitive bidding by small businesses.

The hearings will be conducted from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. each day in the U.S. Department of Interior Auditorium, 1001 N.E. Lloyd Boulevard.

All persons interested in testifying may file with the Small Business Administration on or before August 20, written statements of facts, opinions or arguments concerning the timber set-aside program as implemented by the agency. Requests to make oral statements must also be filed by August 20.

The SBA timber set-aside program was established under authority of the Small Business Act of 1958. Under the program, cooperative agreements have been developed with the Bureau of Land Management and the forest service.

SBA representatives assigned to cover major timber sales activities will review the cutting program and the yearly sales plan with the forest supervisor or district manager of each national forest or BLM timber lands. Resulting set-aside sales will be jointly determined by SBA and the forest service or BLM.

100 Missing In Floods

BOGOTA, Colombia (AP)—A search was under way today for 100 persons still missing after a flash flood wrecked a village in central Colombia. Eighty bodies had been recovered.

Torrential rains in the Andes Mountains set off landslides, creating new dangers in the stricken Tolima province around Ibagu, the provincial capital 80 miles southwest of Bogota.

Rains continued in the region. The small Cabiema River went on a rampage Monday night and all but wiped out the village of Caserio Juntas, eight miles from Ibagu. Fifty identified bodies were lined up in the plaza of the village.
