

Couple Who Were In Love, Meet Again After 14 Years

CHICAGO (AP) — They met again after 14 years quite by coincidence in a city of some four million people.

And Wednesday another step was taken to fit together the jagged pieces of the lives of a man and woman who first became acquainted in a displaced persons camp and married in the turmoil of postwar Europe.

The story really begins with their marriage.

They neither saw nor heard from one another until the chance meeting in Chicago last year.

After the joyous shock, Janusz, now about 36, and Maria, about 31, decided they still were in love and wanted to be together.

After their separation, Janusz heard that his wife was dead; relatives said they had attended her funeral. There was no word of the baby.

Janusz settled in Chicago in 1950 and found work as a skilled laborer. He also met Irena Bielinska and they married on Nov. 10, 1951. They have three children.

But Maria was not dead. She sought her husband through the International Refugee Organization but learned nothing. IRO listed Janusz as "lost."

Maria later married Czeslaw Zawojcki. They have four children. All were born in the United States where Maria and Czeslaw came in 1950.

Maria was granted a divorce last March. She was given custody of two children, her husband two.

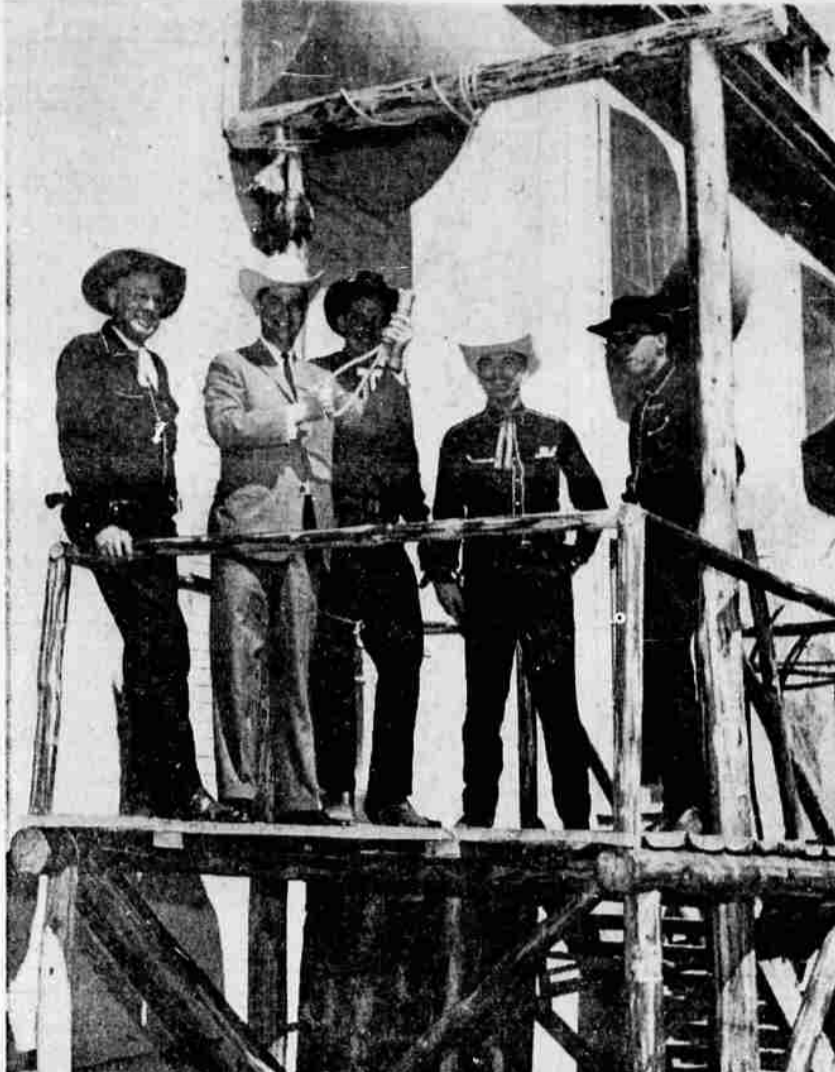
Janusz Wednesday filed a petition in Superior Court for annulment of his marriage to Irena, offering to pay support for their three children.

If granted, he will return to

Maria. Their daughter was adopted by Zawojcki when he married Maria, and legal action is necessary in the case.

Brazil Planes Seeking Sub

RIO DE JANEIRO (AP)—Brazilian planes and torpedo boats searched today for a mystery submarine which a Brazilian naval task force reported sighting in the south Atlantic 55 miles off the coast.

The Navy command ordered an attack if the sub was located and refused to identify itself. However, contact had been lost since noon Wednesday.

A diplomatic source said it was unlikely that a friendly submarine would be in the area. He said there are no U.S. submarines in the south Atlantic at this time.

A Brazilian Navy communique said a strange periscope was spotted Wednesday morning off the coast of the northeastern state of Bahia while Brazilian submarines on maneuver were running on the surface.

The mystery sub was reported running submerged at four knots and on a westerly course, headed toward the coast.

The task force commander said contact was maintained for 20 minutes through sonar — underwater sound-echo equipment.

"The naval general staff decided that the task force should attack the possible submarine should it not identify itself through sonar... (but) the suspected target was not attacked for lack of opportunity," the communique said.
