KF Cubs Schedule Indians

The perennial bugaboo of the Klamath Cubs, the lack of ample time and space for sufficient practice, has to be ignored this week as the Klamath Cubs head into one of the stiffest tests of the Northern California league baseball schedule when they play host to the league leading Yreka Indians in Gem Stadium Sunday.

The holiday weekend test finds the Cubs, one game down to the Yrekaans already this year, facing a pitching assortment that promises a real challenge to Kub batting power.

The fourth-place Pirates handed the Braves their second straight loss on boots by Wise and losing reliever Don McMahon (2-1) in the 10th. Bill Virdon's bunt single loaded the bases and Dick Groat broke it up with a single.

Warren Spahn started for the Braves and allowed only three hits in his seven innings, yet trailed 3-1. Two walks, errors by Mantilla and O'Brien and singles by Ramon Mejias and winning pitcher Vern Law gave the Pirates three runs in the second.

Southpaw Danny McDevitt (8-6) won his fifth in a row for the Dodgers and gained his second shutout although tagged for 10 hits, all singles. The Dodgers made four double plays. Rookie Dick Ricketts (1-4) lost it, giving up consecutive triples by Junior Gilliam and Charlie Neal in the third.

Ernie Banks' 21st homer was good for three Cub runs and Al Dark and Dale Long each hit two-run homers, Glen Hobbie (9-7) won it.

Newcombe (9-4) beat the Phils with a six-hitter and homered for the clincher in the sixth. Gus Bell drove in four Red runs with a homer and a double, Ruben Gomez (1-6) was the loser. In the opener, Gene Fresse hit a grand slam homer as the Phils scored five in the third.

Lend Lease Netter Wins At Wimbledon

WIMBLEDON, England (AP) — Alex Olmedo, Peruvian star of the U.S. Davis Cup team, established himself as the world's No. 1 amateur tennis player today by smashing Australia's Red Laver 6-4, 6-3, 6-4 for the Wimbledon championship.

Before a capacity crowd, including the Duchess of Kent and Princess Margaret, Olmedo cracked Laver's service in the opening game and never trailed, although he suffered mild lapses during the swifter paced match.

Olmedo was seeded No. 1. Laver, a red-haired giant killer who knocked off America's Barry MacKay in the semifinals, was ignored by the ranking committee.

Earl Sheridan, local promoter, reports that another five or six are also expected to show up for Saturday's program.

The eight-event program will get underway with the time trials beginning at 7 p.m., followed by the trophy dashes at 8 o'clock.

In becoming the first South American ever to take the title, the 23-year-old descendant of the Incas cracked a three-year monopoly on the crown by Australia. Lew Hoad won in 1956 and 1957 and Ashley Cooper in 1958.

Tigers 9, Chi Sox 7

Maxwell's homer, off reliever Turk Lown, gave the Tigers a 9-2 lead that was just enough. The White Sox chased winner Don Mossi (7-3) in a five-run ninth triggered by Al Smith's grand-slam. Bob Shaw (6-3) lost it.

One of four Cleveland errors gave the A's the clincher in a two-run fifth when Bill Tuttle hit an RBI triple and scored himself on Jim Baxes' relay error. Ray Herbert (5-7) won it with Johnny Kucks' relief help. Gary Bell (6-8) was the loser.

The Orioles beat Don Larsen (6-3) for the first time in 12 decisions since September 5, 1955, although they managed only five hits. They scored all their runs on three hits in the first two innings. Bob Nieman followed Gene Woodling's two-out single with his ninth home run in the first, and winning pitcher Jerry Walker (6-3) drove the other with a two-out bloop single in the second.

Jim Lemon doubled home the tying run in the eighth for Washington, then broke it up with a three-run homer in the 10th off reliever Leo Kiely (2-2).
