Kathy Walker and Julie Weber, nieces of the bride, were flower girls.

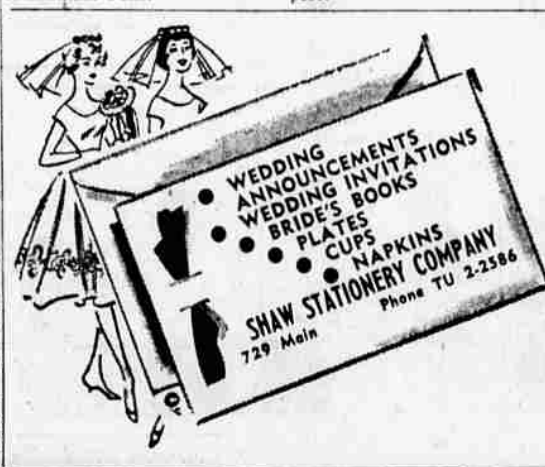
John Harrison was best man and ushers were Dean Peugh, brother of the bride, and G. W. Broadway Jr., the bridegroom's brother.
