

# Bob Bolin Sets NWL Record

Wenatchee took over the undisputed lead in the Northwest League Tuesday night, but the big excitement was the way big Bob Bolin had 'em swinging at the breeze.

Wenatchee allowed Yakima scores in only one inning and came out with a 12-6 victory. Bolin struck out 22 batters—and set a NWL record doing it—as Eugene edged Salem 2-0. Jim Johnson threw a three-hit shutout at Tri-City as Lewiston won 6-0.

Bolin, a 6-foot-5, 200-pound right-hander, put 17 Senators down swinging and caught another five on called third strikes. He walked five, but only two of these got as far as second. Salem's two hits were singles. Eugene's only earned run came in the fourth on Mel Krause's triple and Gene Martin's single.

It looked like a runaway for the Chiefs as they took a 3-0 lead after two innings. Then the Bears bounced back for six runs in the fourth on six hits—including doubles by Ron Liptak and George Player—a walk, two errors and a passed ball. The Suds made it 11 series openers in a row they have tucked away in the victory column by coming from behind in the eighth inning to nudge the Portland Beavers 2-1.

The second-place Vancouver Mounties belted the stumbling Spokane Indians twice, 1-0 and 7-3, and gained a half game on the Sacramento Solons, to turned back San Diego's Padres 8-4. Sacramento has a two-game cushion.

In the league's other tussle, the Phoenix Giants made the most of only six hits and a ninth inning rally in edging the Salt Lake City Bees 5-4.
