LOS ANGELES (AP) — Hyun Choo Oh, a hazle-eyed beauty from Korea, is in town for the Miss Universe contest in nearby Long Beach. She had these bright words for interviewers: On romance "No, I've never been kissed. Well, just once, a few days ago in Honolulu, by an American general. I gave him some flowers. He kissed me on the cheek—but I didn't feel anything."

On boys "I've never had a date with a boy. They just don't do things like that in Korea." Miss Oh is 19 and a student at Ehwa University in Seoul. After the contest she plans to go London to study ballet. She is here for the July 19-24 contest with her mother, Chum Chul Park, and a chaperon, Nora Noh.

"My job," said Miss Noh, "is to say 'no' to the boys."

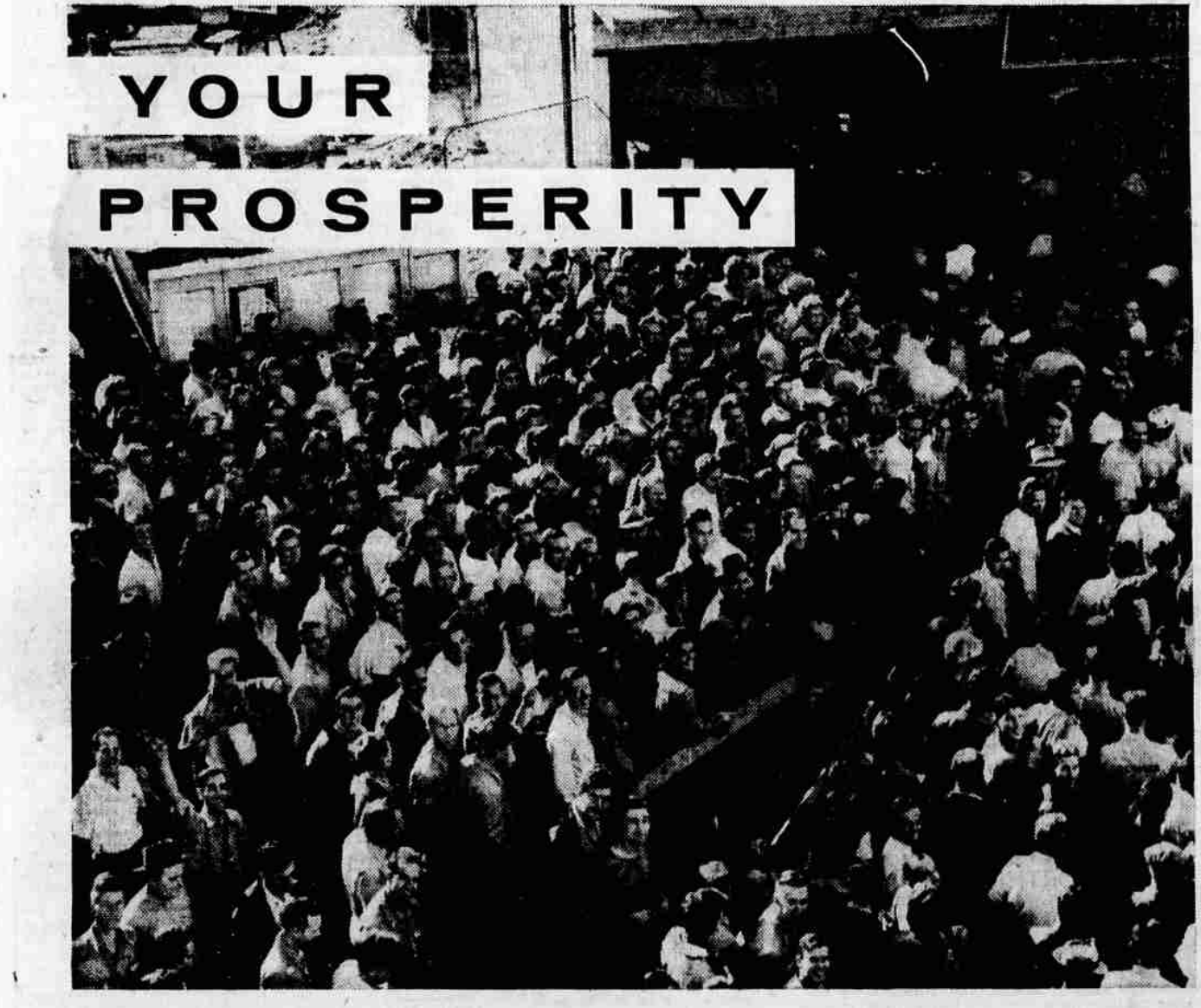
