Perkins Justifies Top Seed

PORTLAND (AP)—Doyle Perkins of Seattle justified again his top-seeded position in the men's singles of the Oregon Tennis Tournament Thursday by beating Dave Reed of Glendale, Calif., 8-6, 5-7, 6-3.

That victory over the adept teenager qualified him for one of today's quarter-final matches, against Clyde Knox of Portland, seeded No. 5.

Another quarter-final match pairs Bill Rose of Portland, No. 4, against fifth-seeded Bill Hoogs of Berkeley, Calif.

Hoogs Thursday whipped Larry Hunt of Bellevue, Wash., 6-3, 6-4, while Rose upended Jim Flynn of Portland 6-2, 6-2.

Jack Neer of Portland, No. 3, and third-ranked Mike Crane of Berkeley, Calif., each won quarter-final matches Thursday and meet in a semi-final today.

Two of the seeded players were beaten Thursday. Seventh-ranked Omar Pabst of Portland lost to Don Stensaas of Modesto, Calif. Stensaas, though, then lost to Crane.

The No. 8 player, Jimmy Jackson of Portland, went down to a 6-2, 7-5 defeat at the hands of Neer.

The first big pro golf tournament ever to be held in Klamath Falls will get under way Monday, July 13, and continue through Thursday, July 17, at Reames Golf and Country Club. The tourney, Oregon Professional Golfers Match Play Tournament, will see approximately 50 pro golfers gather to vie for 32 positions in the three-day classic.

Reames pro, Clark Good, hosts the affair which will be directed by tourney chairman Eddie Hogan. Slated to appear is OPGA President Harry Clow. Clow is the pro at the Royal Oaks course in Vancouver, Washington.

The field includes big-name pro golfers from Oregon. Among the field will be Alex Kingsfather of Oakway Country Club, who captured the Pro-Am event in 1950 and is known for his long drive, Jerry Cloninger of the Prineville Country Club, winner of state amateur crowns in Utah and Montana in 1954 and No. 1 man for the Oregon State College team in 1954, Harold West of the Longview, Washington, Country Club, winner of the Oregon Open in 1948 and 1950, Oregon PGA in 1951 and 1954 and Northwest Open in 1951, Walter Porterfield of the Grants Pass Country Club, winner of the 1958 OPGA.

Others include Harvey Hixson of the Laurelwood Country Club in Eugene, winner of the Oregon Assistant Pro in both 1956 and 1957, Ed Oldfield of Astor Country Club, Warrenton, who won the 1956 Roseburg Open and Northwest PGA in 1958 and Robert McKendrick of Lake Oswego Country Club, who was the 1957 Oregon PGA champion.

Swim Boss Predicts Speedy Relay Team

LOS ALTOS, Calif. (AP)—A prominent swimming coach forecast today that the United States can assemble a swimming relay team capable of breaking the world record for 400 meters.

As the National AAU men's senior championships got under way at the Fremont Hills Country Club here, predictions of fast times came from Willis Casey, swimming coach at North Carolina State.

He's also the man who next week will head a 16-man United States squad to Tokyo for a meet with the top Japanese swimmers.

"We have at least five swimmers capable of swimming 100 meters in 56 seconds or less," Casey declared. "With the relay starts, a four-man team should be capable of 3:44 and the record is 3:46.3 by an Australian team last year."

Casey listed Jeff Farrell, formerly of Oklahoma and now in the Navy, Joe Alkire of San Diego, Lance Larson of the Los Angeles Athletic Club and Carl Wooley and Dick Hanley of the Detroit Swim Club as the five capable of breaking 56 seconds.

They compete tonight in the opening program of the three-evening national meet. Also on the first program are the 1,500-meter freestyle, the 400-meter freestyle and the 3-meter springboard diving events.

After competing at Tokyo and Osaka, the team will return to the United States for the Aug. 7 tryouts for the Pan-American games.

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
