Dry professional development fund, a project of the auxiliary, to attend the workshop at Denver, Colorado, on the orientation and mobility of the blind. He told the auxiliary that "it takes fully trained personnel to teach the blind to get around with independence and ease."

The fund is named for the long-time superintendent of the blind school.

Approximately 500 women attended the sessions, representing 80 auxiliaries in Oregon.

At the state meeting Mrs. Clarence Humble, a past president of the state auxiliary, was appointed chairman of the Oregon Mothers

of the Year Club, of which the Lions Auxiliary is a charter member.

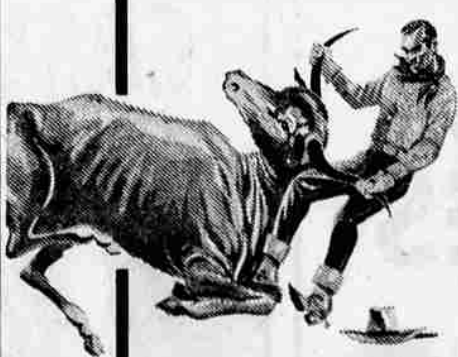
Following the reports on the convention a final report on the local eye conservation program was given by the chairman, Mrs. Loy Barker.

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**Yacht Club Opened
To New Bridge Club**

Klamath Yacht Club is opening its beautiful club rooms to the public for the use of the Lake-shore Duplicate Bridge Club being organized by Mrs. David A. Richardson, who has been conducting bridge classes the last few years in this city.

This club will be the first organized duplicate bridge under national supervision ever to be offered to the bridge players in this city. It is franchised under the American Contract Bridge League and will be able to issue fractional master points to the winners of its regular games, and full master points for special events. This will serve to bring national recognition and prestige to the players.

The duplicate games will be held regularly on Thursday evenings, beginning July 23. It is hoped that an afternoon or morning session will also be scheduled in the near future, depending on the needs of the local players.
