Dr. Petroff came to this city with his wife, the former Madelon Adler, daughter of Dr. and Mrs. George Adler, now of Camp White. He is now a practicing physician in Portland.

The Bohemians are a group of

business and professional men, aged 24 to 35, representing many occupations. They were organized four and a half years ago and since that time have appeared many times in the Portland area and throughout the Northwest, including appearances before President Eisenhower in 1956 as well as two guest appearances with the Portland Symphony orchestra.

The group sings in eight languages, including music of nearly every kind, which makes them particularly suited for the tour for which they have been invited. In addition to the concerts in American military bases in France and Germany, they have been asked to sing at the University of Munich. Plans are also being made for them to broadcast over

Radio Free Europe and appear on German TV.

The singers will leave Portland July 17 and will leave from McGuire Air Force Base in New Jersey, July 22.

Just prior to their departure for Europe, the Bohemians are scheduled to appear on Garry Moore's (Andy Williams) TV show on July 21.

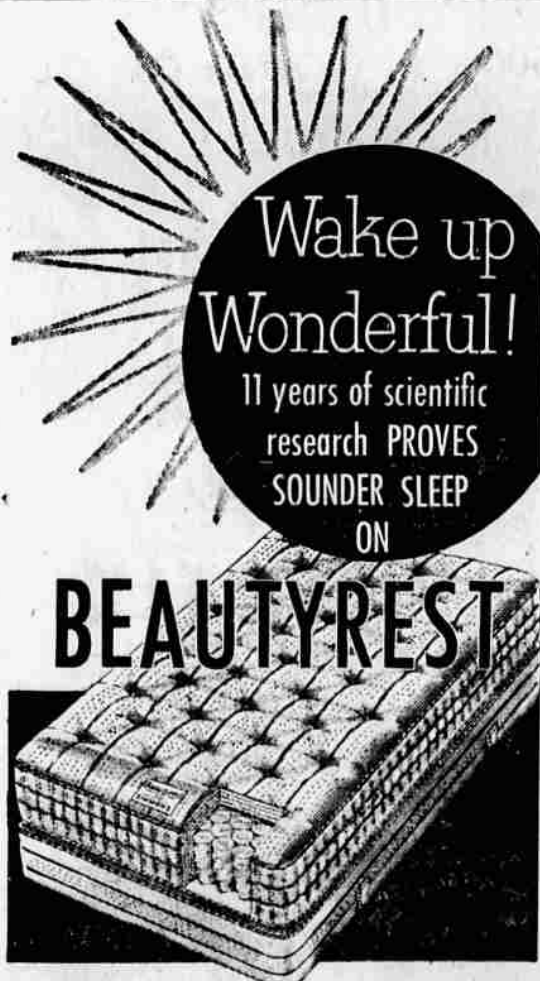
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
