The gun, designed for firing blanks in fast draw competition, features a shortened barrel, a stubbed off stock and a greatly enlarged — and all handmade — finger lever. The weapon hangs in a special holster which allows it to be fired by merely tipping it up and blasting away. The holster can be seen in the foreground. According to Phillips the fast draw craze is still gaining and no end in sight yet.

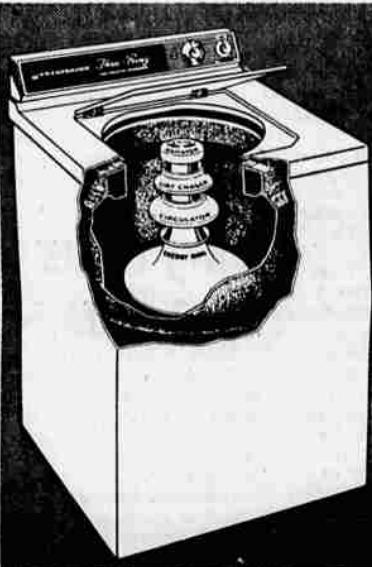

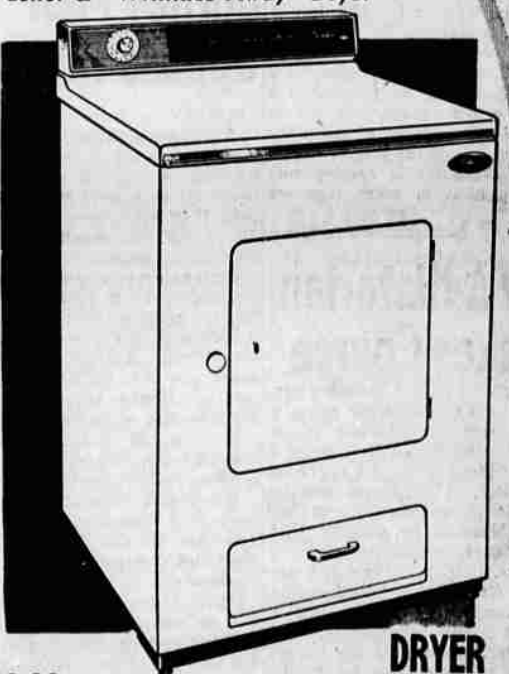
