

Car Makers Will Endure

DETROIT (AP)—Auto manufacturers will be able to survive a 60 to 90-day steel strike with no particular strain.

The auto industry normally absorbs about 15 to 20 per cent of the total steel production.

All the automakers have vast steel stockpiles, plus about one million 1959 models already built and ready for sale.

This inventory of new cars should last about 60 days, even if no more 1959 models are built. That would carry dealers close to the introduction dates for 1960 models.

Long-range plans call for all Chrysler Corp. production of 1959 models to end by early August and for General Motors production to end during August. Ford division planned to run until early September with other Ford Motor Co. production shutting down in August.

Ford will be the least affected by the strike since it normally makes about 50 per cent of its steel at its Rouge plant in suburban Dearborn. This plant is ranked 13th among all U.S. steel plants in capacity and can make 1,898,600 tons of ingots in a year.

The other automakers have accumulated enough steel for the big initial runs of 1960 models.

Mills Made Vows Good

NEW YORK (AP)—Steel mills made good use of the two-week steel labor contract extension to take care of their customers, Iron Age magazine said today. Shipments were very heavy, the publication added.

The national metalworking weekly, making no mention of a steel strike in its news release, said steel mills were still uncertain how strong their market will be when operations are back to normal.

Mills producing large-tonnage carbon steel products know there was a massive inventory buildup in the first half of the year but are encouraged, Iron Age said, by these facts:

1. There have been no significant cancellations or deferrals since the start of July.
2. Talks with customers indicate most want all the steel they have ordered.
3. The rate of incoming orders at one large mill last week was about in line with its operating rate.
4. Plate and structural schedules are already 50 per cent filled for September.

Demo Rips State Aide

Miracle Promised By Reds; Exhibit Completion Slated

MOSCOW (AP)—With the opening of the U.S. Exhibition in Moscow by Vice President Richard M. Nixon only 10 days away, the fairgrounds still look more like a bomb site than a shiny advertisement of the American way of life.

The staging in Gorki Park is so far from completion it looks as if only a miracle could finish it on time—but Soviet workmen are promising to work the miracle. Seventy-five young Russian-speaking Americans, brought over to act as guides at the exhibit, were handed brooms, paint brushes and frying pans immediately on arrival.

Two of the girls were led to hot plates to fix snacks for superintendents and foremen too busy to leave the grounds to eat.

There is plenty of enthusiasm—and optimism—about the outcome. John C. Folger, U.S. ambassador to Belgium, visited the fair site and predicted the American exhibition here would surpass that at the Brussels World Fair in 1958.

The exhibit is to show off "American life, industry and culture" to the Soviet people as a companion piece to the Soviet exhibition being held in New York.

The framework of the main exhibition hall is still being bolted together but the structure is essentially complete. Some individual exhibits are already in place.

Bulldozers are still tearing up and replacing earth for the landscaping, drain pipes are still being laid. The grounds are a mud patch with no grass.

The Americans are particularly annoyed at Soviet insistence that a network of steel braces be built around the outside of the vast aluminum dome of the main exhibit hall.

The mass of ugly steel bracing takes away much of the airy lightness of the gold-tinted aluminum dome—the architectural centerpiece of the exhibition. There have been all sorts of aggravating little hitches but the

workers generally have shown genuine enthusiasm.

The Soviets refused to allow skilled Finnish carpenters to assemble a prefabricated building made in Finland and insisted on doing the work themselves. The Finns patiently taught the Soviets how to do the job.

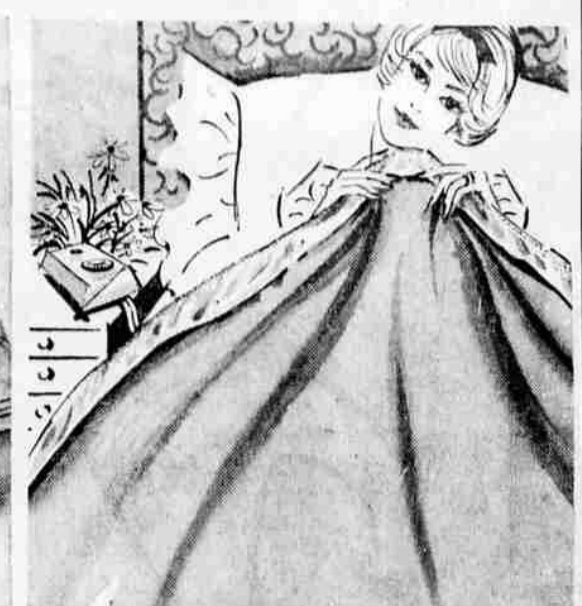

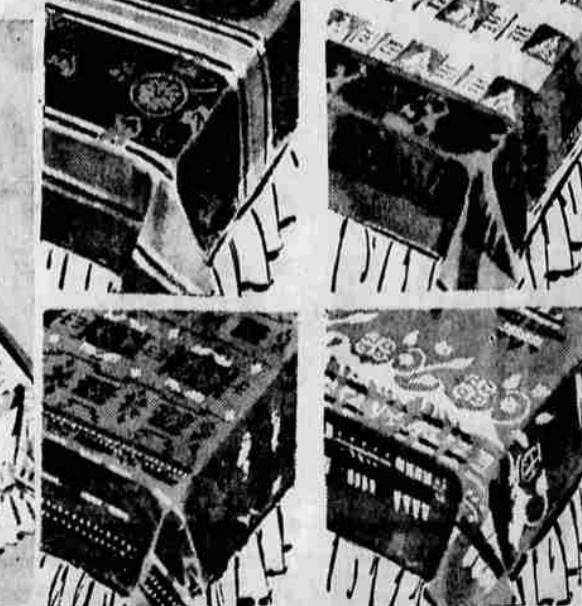
