Geneva Seen As Location For Possible Summit Talks

GENEVA (AP)—There seems to be a tacit understanding with the Soviets that the East-West summit conference—if it is arranged—will be held in Geneva.

Western diplomats think it will come soon after the windup of Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev's Scandinavian tour Aug. 30.

The United States, Britain and France are reported taking it for granted that the conference will be confined to the Big Four powers.

East and West German delegates almost certainly will be along to serve as "advisers" in any talks on Berlin and the wider problems of a German peace settlement.

Girl, 17, Safe After Ordeal

DETROIT (AP)—Blonde Ann Piri, 17, was back safe at home today while her onetime boyfriend was in jail for a 10-hour armed abduction which ended when he fell asleep.

The girl was kidnaped at rifle point from her suburban Highland Park home Wednesday by John Thompson, 22, prison parolee who said later he "blacked out" and could not recall what happened.

Family members said Thompson, who used to keep company with Miss Piri, invaded the home at 4:30 a.m., seized the girl in her night clothing and drove off with her after firing a shot into a wall.

In midafternoon both were found 15 miles north, near Pontiac.

Miss Piri appeared at a home reporting "a man is chasing me with a gun." Police then found Thompson, wearing the leather jacket of a motorcycle club, asleep on a blanket beside the car, in a lover's lane.

He still had the rifle but surrendered without resistance. He was held for investigation of kidnaping. Discharged from the Army in 1956 as "undesirable," he is on parole from a burglary sentence.

Later Sunday, veteran hunter George Converse and Ransome Stewart, who has hounds, found the bear's tracks and followed them for some distance. They veered off over into the Kelly Creek Basin.
