

Fiscal Year 1959 Ends With \$12.5 Billion Deficit

WASHINGTON (AP)—The government wound up the unhappy fiscal year 1959 on June 30 with a peacetime record deficit of 12½ billion dollars.

The deficit was the fourth and largest turned in by the Eisenhower administration, as against two surpluses. But it was 330 million dollars less than President Eisenhower estimated six months ago in his budget message to Congress.

Eisenhower's predecessor, Harry S. Truman, had three surpluses and five deficits during his term in office, including the \$9,449,000,000 deficit for fiscal 1953 at the

peak of the Korean War spending. The Treasury and Budget Bureau released without comment Monday these preliminary 1959 fiscal year-end totals:

Receipts \$68,158,142,030.
Expenditures \$80,698,842,169.
Deficit \$12,540,700,139.

Eighteen months ago, in his budget message of January 1958, Eisenhower had forecast a 500-million-dollar surplus for the 1959 fiscal year.

That vanished when the business recession bit deeply into tax collections. At the same time the Soviet missile challenge, some antirecession spending, and other

factors pushed government spending up.

On June 30 the debt stood at \$287,705,907,078, a record for any fiscal year-end. That was 15 billion dollars higher than at the peak of World War II.

Government revenues for several months have reflected the recovery of business. Tax revenues were 150 million dollars higher than Eisenhower predicted six months ago because of larger corporation and excise tax collections.

Spending in the same six months was 172 million dollars less than Eisenhower had foreseen. Most of the departments and agencies spent a little less than they had been budgeted for.

These economy efforts more than absorbed a 100-million-dollar rise in the cost of interest payments on the national debt, and a 417-million-dollar rise in Defense Department outlays for military programs.

Government spending in fiscal 1959, at \$80,700,000,000, was far above any other peacetime year. It compared with actual outlays

Youths From 51 Countries Gather For Scout Conclave

MOUNT MAKILING, Philippines (AP)—Some quiet reminders of the sterner outside world appear amid the atmosphere of brotherhood here where boys from 51 nations are gathered for the first World Boy Scout Jamboree ever held in Asia.

Jews chat with turbaned Arabs and blacks eat with whites in the multi-nation "campsites" spread over the rolling mountainside "Jamboree City" south of Manila. But there are also signs of world conflicts, old and new.

Even the youngest of the scouts in the big Japanese delegation, for example, might pause for thought at a banner in a Philippine camp which says "Remember Pearl Harbor." Another display by the delegation from Bataan province stresses the war theme and includes quotes from Gen. Douglas MacArthur.

World scouting leaders say they would like to hold the next jamboree in the Middle East, possibly in the United Arab Republic. But, because the Israeli delegation would not or could not attend, they say chances are very dim.

There are 28 scouts in exile who march proudly in parades and move among 12,000 scouts gathered here. They are from Communist countries where the scouting movement is banned. Twenty-five belong to the Council of Scout Associations in Exile. They include Hungarians, Russians, Lithuanians and Ukrainians, now living mostly in the United States, Britain and Australia.

The other three are Poles, not associated with the council but working in cooperation with it. Kazimierz Sabbat, international commissioner of the Polish Boy Scouts with headquarters in London, says there are 12,500 scouts in his organization, scattered throughout the world.

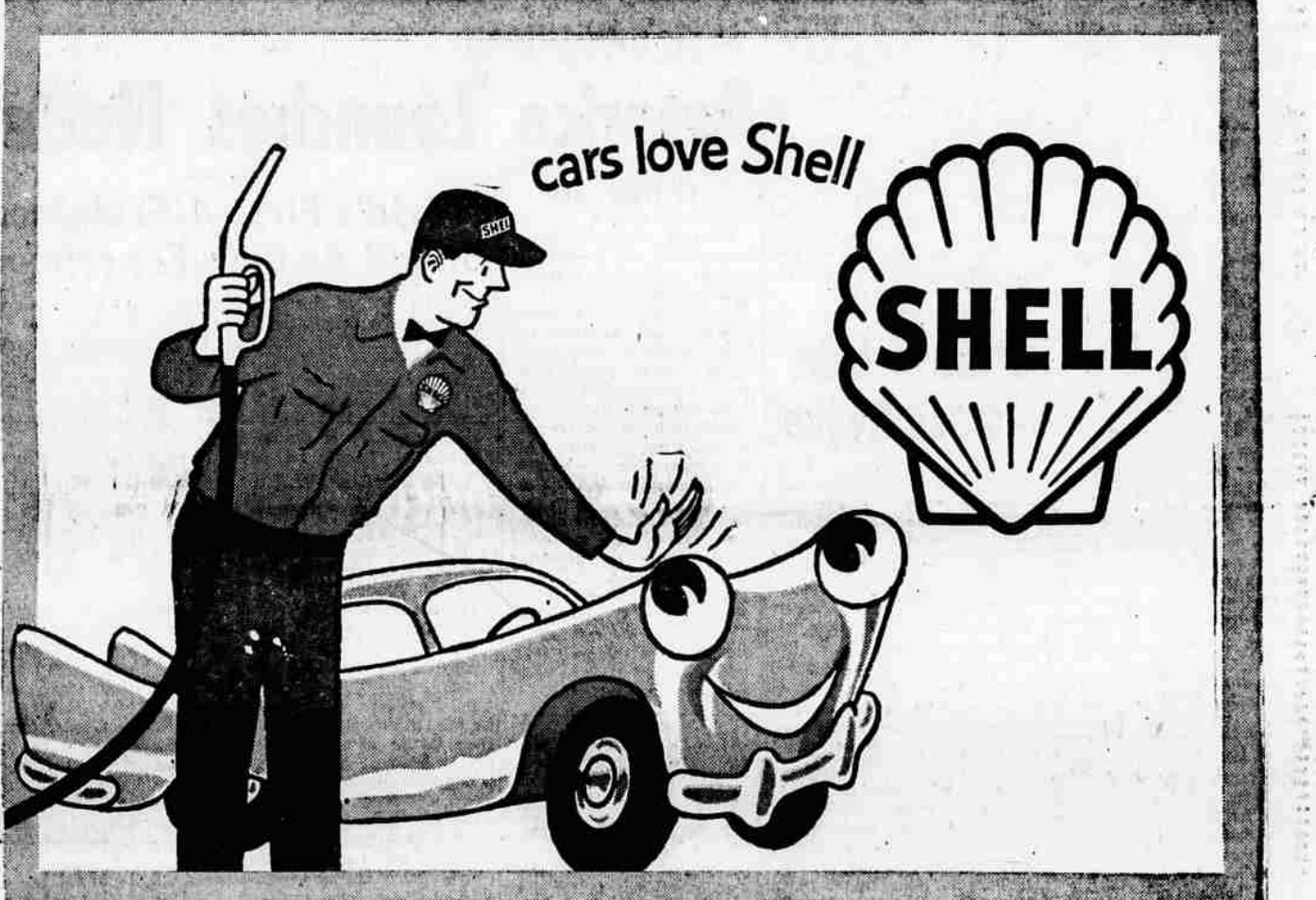
