## Runaway Milkman And Girl Returned To New Jersey

NEW BRUNSWICK, N.J. (AP) — Ernest T. Corrao, the runaway milkman, was in jail Saturday, and Barbara Plaisted, 14, the girl he is accused of abducting, was home with her parents.

It was the first time in seven months the two have been separated. Holding hands, they stepped off a plane from Texas at Idlewild Airport in New York Friday and were brought here under police guard.

Corrao, 39, skipped off last January, leaving behind a wife and three children in nearby Old Bridge. Police said Barbara had told them she had begged to go with him. "I loved him too much to let him go," they quoted her as saying.

Since then, the couple had lived in Anahuac, Tex., where Corrao clerked in a supermarket. Police caught up with them there after becoming suspicious of the 1957 New Jersey plates on Corrao's car.

Two Middlesex County detectives accompanied the pair back from Texas. Corrao went straight

to the County Jail here in lieu of \$10,000 bail. He is being held on two charges — abduction, and desertion and nonsupport of his family.

Barbara went first to the County Juvenile Detention Home, charged with incorrigibility. Her father, Allen Plaisted, 43, put up \$2,500 bail and took her home. She is due later for a physical examination at a hospital.

In the deep woods under the fern were lambs-tongue, leopard lily, trillium, solomon seal and the white lily, queen's cup.
