Educators Eye Problem

ASHLAND, Ore. (AP) — Dr. O. Meredith Wilson, University of Oregon president, Sunday launched the Pacific Northwest Conference on Higher Education on one of its theme — the problem of superior students.

Superior students, he said, never will get adequate attention or perform to the degree of excellence possible as long as society wants and expects so little from them. He recommended a review of how much is expected of students in one year.

The two-day conference, which ends today, drew presidents and faculty members from 43 schools in seven Western states and British Columbia. The Pacific Coast Committee of the American Council on Education and Oregon's state Board of Higher Education also are meeting simultaneously in Ashland.

Centennial Ship Takes To Water

GARIBALDI, Ore. (AP) — The Morning Star II was launched Sunday, christened with a bottle of water that came from the seven rivers and four bays of Tillamook County.

The ship, a replica of the first sailing schooner built in Oregon, was christened by Mrs. Lena Vaughn Goodspeed, 75. She is a daughter of one of the four men who built the original ship.

The first ship carried supplies up the Columbia River from Astoria to Portland. The new ship, Tillamook's chief effort to mark the state's centennial, also will travel up the Columbia to Portland.

The ship, which took five months to complete, was built by Tillamook County citizens at a cost of \$45,000.

Jets Slash Journey Time

HILLSBORO, Ore. (AP)—Three Air Force F-104C Starfighter jets streaked from Independence, Mo., to Independence, Ore., Sunday in 2 hours and 10 minutes — a far cry from the nearly four months required by the On-to-Oregon Cavalcade.

The Starfighters, which can travel at twice the speed of sound, slowed down below the sound barrier to avoid sonic booms, but still covered more miles in a minute than a covered wagon could in a day.

The jets, which took off from Richards-Gebaur Air Force Base near Independence, Mo., circled back over the Oregon Centennial Air Circus, then landed at Portland Air Base. They refueled en route at Casper, Wyo.

The three pilots were Lt. Col. Delynn Anderson, Louisville, Ky.; Capt. Cecil Lefevers, Ft. Worth, Tex.; and 1st Lt. Richard Lougee, Milwaukee, Wis.

The Air Circus drew some 15,000 persons, including 100 pilots who flew in and were entertained at a Fly in Breakfast by the Oregon Sportsmen Pilots. Another 100 planes were displayed.

The grand marshal of the event was Kirby Grant, television's Sky King.
