## KF Nationals Nip Lakeview

Third baseman Jim Puter may have felt a bit low when he committed three errors during the game but a happier lad couldn't be found when he powered a two-run triple in the top of the eighth inning which gave the KF Nationals a thrilling 10-8 victory over Lakeview in the opening game of the District Babe Ruth League Tournament in Gem Stadium Tuesday night.

Puter's powerful wallop, coupled with some fine relief work on the part of red-hot, right-handed pitcher, Merrill's Sam Walker, moves the Nationals Stars into the second round of the championship bracket at the stadium tonight. Their foe is the second Klamath Falls entrant, the American League All-Stars, who drew a bye the first time around.

The loss, by no means a finality for the Lakeview Stars in the double elimination tourney, gives them a day off and brings them back into action Thursday night against the loser of tonight's contest.

Puter, who committed a pair of boo-boos on third and repeated once in left field, led the Nationals 12-hit attack with the triple and a pair of singles to chase home five KF tallies.

Lakeview third sacker Wayne Russell blasted a triple and single in five trips and accounted for two RBI's in leading his mates at the plate. The only other Lakeview safety was credited to shortstop Gene Mills. All three hits were garnered off National starter, lefty Marvin Davis.

The defeat became the property of Jim Godby who entered the game as relief for starter Gary Reynolds, one-third of the way along in the first frame. Godby allowed nine hits, walked six and fanned three. Reynolds gave up three hits and two walks. Walker, who notched credit for the victory, replaced Davis with one down in the sixth and allowed no hits, walked one man

and fanned four in his 2-3-1 inning stint. Davis issued only three hits but broke out in a rash of seven free passes in the fifth and sixth stanzas before Walker came to his assistance.

KF second sacker Larry Chance crowded Puter for the batting honors with a triple and a single that accounted for two RBI's. Other KFers to collect two hits included little first baseman Larry Binney and outfielder Dick Carleton, both of whom rapped a brace of singles.

The Nats got off to a three run bulge in the first stanza when leadoff man Dennis Coleman doubled and Binney and Chance followed with back to back one-basers. Walks issued Ron Simpson and Carleton were followed up by Puter's first single.

The Nats notched two more in the third but Lakeview, which had counted one run in the second off two errors, collected three more in the last of the third off Russell's three-master and two more miscues.

KF pulled out to an 8-5 edge in the sixth but Lakeview rose and hooked the count full, off four walks, a wild pitch and two more bobbles, in the bottom of the frame. The Lakeview surge was successfully put down in the seventh by Walker who picked up three strikeouts in the last two stanzas.

## Major Records Set By Archers In Bend

BEND, Ore. (AP) — Records were established Tuesday in four major events of the National Field Archery Assn. Tournament here.

Carl Heinrich of Richmond, Mich., ended the field round of the men's instinctive competition with a score of 928 — far exceeding the old mark of 894.

The old mark was set a year ago by Lon Stanton of Ozark, Miss. He was runnerup to Heinrich Tuesday, with a score of 919. Third was Rawleigh Basinger of Aliquippa, Pa., at 895.

In the field round of the men's freestyle, Robert Kadile of Rochester, Minn., finished with 992. That snapped the former record of 975 set last year by Leo Baldwin of Wellsville, N.Y.

James Mackey, Bradford, Pa., also exceeded the old record. His 986 made him runnerup to Kadile. Baldwin was third with 979.

Cleo Robertson of Samaria, Mich., had 844 in the women's freestyle of the field round. That exceeded her 1958 record of 810.

The record-breaking was continued in the women's instinctive of the field round. Faye Scovner of Modesto, Calif., shot 729. The former mark was 715.

When the field round ended Tuesday, the hunter round immediately began. Half of that round was run off Tuesday afternoon, but the results to that point disturbed the aggregate leaders little.

The over-all championships will be decided on the basis of the aggregate scores.

The final half of the hunter round will end today, and then the big game round is scheduled to be run off. That will wind up the tournament Thursday.

## White Sox Recapture First; LA Dodgers Half Game Short

The White Sox aren't the hitless wonders of long ago but they still make one run go a long way. They've scored fewer runs than any other American League team except Baltimore but they're back in first place by a half-game today because their pitching and defense win the close ones.

They're streaking now with six wins in their last seven games—and five of the victories were by one run. What's more they've compiled a 24-5 mark in one-run games and are only 14 shy of the AL record for one-run victories in a single season.

**ChiSox 4, Yanks 3**  
They came through with one of their most important decisions of the season Tuesday night when Billy Pierce's sturdy pitching and Al Smith's two-run eighth-inning homer produced a 4-3 win over floundering New York Yankees. A crowd of 43,829—largest of the season in Chicago's Comiskey Park—saw the White Sox dump the world champions into fifth place.

The Cleveland Indians slipped back into second place when they lost, 8-4, after beating the Boston Red Sox, 5-2 the Kansas City A's stretched their winning streak to a major league season high of nine by beating the Washington Senators, 6-1, and the Detroit Tigers defeated the Orioles, 8-3, in other AL games.

The Los Angeles Dodgers climbed within a half-game of the National League lead when they beat the Pittsburgh Pirates, 9-4, and the Philadelphia Phillies
