

Fallout Mulled By Governors

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico, (UPI) — A five-governor committee proposed to the governors conference today a combined federal, state and local effort to provide civilian protection against radioactive fallout as "a major contribution to peace."

The committee was headed by New York's Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller, but its recommendations did not go as far as a New York state advisory committee which recently proposed to him that fallout shelters be compulsory for all New York state residents.

Other members of the governors committee were Govs. G. Mennen Williams of Michigan, Edmund Brown of California, and Ernest F. Hollings of South Carolina, all Democrats, and J. Hugo Aronson of Montana, a Republican; as is Rockefeller.

Their report called for state educational campaigns on the dangers of fallout and for federal, state and local campaigns to help individuals protect themselves against fallout by shelters and other means.

The report was issued as the resolutions committee prepared to take action on a variety of proposals among them:

—A suggestion by Gov. Luther H. Hodges of North Carolina that the new executive committee of the conference consider inviting the heads of 15 Soviet republics to next year's governors conference to return the recent visit of American governors to Russia.

—A resolution asking Congress to reject President Eisenhower's request for a higher gasoline tax and to divert other automobile excise taxes into the interstate highway program.

—A resolution sponsored by six Democratic governors calling for an early end to the three-week-old steel strike and the appointment of a governors committee to meet with Eisenhower to explore possible solutions.

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Rehabilitation Group Meets

The fourth annual Rehabilitation Institute was held in Pilot Butte Inn at Bend, July 26 - 31, attended by 20 faculty personnel from the Pacific Coast area and about 65 invited participants from Klamath, Clatsop, Lincoln and Linn counties in Oregon, and Humboldt and Shasta-Tehama counties in California.

This institute is jointly sponsored by the University of Oregon, the Oregon Division of Vocational Rehabilitation and the Oregon Tuberculosis and Health Association. It is designed for workers engaged in rendering direct service to the handicapped or in organizing the community to recognize and assume its responsibility for the handicapped.

Special emphasis is placed on a coordinated team approach to this process. The five-day meeting consisted of lectures, group meetings and seminars on techniques in rehabilitation.

Tax Problem Faces Group

PORTLAND (AP) — No recommendations on an increase in gasoline taxes to pay for federal highways will be made at the North American Gasoline Tax Conference here, the organization's president predicted Monday.

Bernard Nossell, deputy chief comptroller of Maryland, is presiding over the three-day conference that has attracted delegates from 35 states and several Canadian provinces.

An increase in gasoline taxes was recommended in an opening speech by E. B. MacNaughton of Portland, chairman of the First National Bank of Oregon board of directors.

MacNaughton advocated pay-as-you-go financing for the nation's interstate highway program, which has run into a financial roadblock.

"We should either have higher gasoline taxes or delay the road building so present revenues can pay for it as we go," MacNaughton said. "The federal government should not even consider bonds to finance the new highways. That kind of financing has put the nation deep in debt."

New Forester Killed By Fall

EVERETT, Wash. (AP) — A 27-year-old forester who came to work for the Department of Natural Resources only a few months ago was killed Monday when he fell and slid 400 feet down a mountainside.

Donald G. Turley, formerly of Richmond Heights, Mo., was working on a forestry inventory in the Sultan Basin, about 40 miles southeast of here, with Mike Tyrrel of Tacoma.

Tyrrel said Turley climbed on up a steep slope to measure some trees. A few minutes later, he shot down the mountainside, rolled through several crevasses and became enmeshed in a rock slide.

Turley was hired following his graduation this year from the University of Missouri school of forestry.
