



THE REV. AND MRS. LARRY FRANK

Temple Hears Gospel Pair

Two young evangelists, the Rev. and Mrs. Larry Frank who have appeared on television with the "Gospel Westerners," are bringing a gospel message to audiences at Klamath Temple, 1007 Pine Street this week.

Meetings each evening except Saturday, beginning at 7:30 will continue through Sunday.

The Rev. and Mrs. Frank co-pastored in Open Bible churches in Centralia and Tacoma before entering the evangelistic field.

They feature a period of sacred songs during each meeting, many of them composed and sung by Mrs. Frank who also gives an original religious poem. These will be featured Thursday night.

Friday night will be Western Night, when the evangelists will appear in western costumes to portray their work on TV for four years. The congregation is also invited to appear in western clothes.

The regular Sunday morning worship service is planned for regular time with the Rev. Frank and the Rev. Harry M. Strachan, pastor of Klamath Temple in the pulpit. Sunday night the evangelist will give his personal story of salvation.

The Rev. Strachan encouraged the Franks to enter the field of evangelism. The Rev. Frank converted 12 years ago, has served as an evangelist for six years after being a public entertainer.

The couple has a teen-age daughter, Becky, who sometimes appears with them, a daughter and son-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. J. D. Thompson live in Nevada; a son, Larry, is in the Navy in San Diego.

Schuh Given Scholarship

Russel Schuh, a 1959 graduate of Klamath Union High School, was recently notified that he has been awarded a University of Oregon Dads' Club partial scholarship of \$252.

Schuh, who ranked seventh in a class of 314, will attend the university in the fall, majoring in chemistry. At the present time he is working for the Klamath Lumber and Box Company. His parents are Mr. and Mrs. Joe Schuh, 4039 Shasta Way.

In an interview, Gen. Valluy said that if he had to undertake a land war in Europe tomorrow there would be three divisions he could not commit immediately — one each from France, Belgium and the Netherlands.

Could the British really muster four divisions? "The British could muster three," Valluy replied.

The general then was asked, "Do all the divisions assigned to your command really exist?" After a moment's reflection, Valluy said, "All the divisions exist but not at full strength."

Thus by Valluy's reckoning the shield force for central Europe now is 17 combat divisions ready for action, but that is not the whole story.

The seven German divisions expected to be integrated with the NATO shield force are:

1. The 1st Panzer Division, 2. The 2nd Panzer Division, 3. The 3rd Panzer Division, 4. The 4th Panzer Division, 5. The 5th Panzer Division, 6. The 6th Panzer Division, 7. The 7th Panzer Division.

These divisions are essentially training divisions. The other three are heavily armored, highly mobile units of 9,000 to 10,000 men each.

If the German training divisions are removed from the list of the combat units, Valluy's land forces are reduced to 13 1/3 divisions, but again that is not the whole story.

Gen. Valluy noted that the British and Belgian forces contain large numbers of foot soldiers. In these days of atomic battlefield weapons and mechanization, the walking soldier may be an anachronism.

Valluy was asked what he considered his major problem. "My main fear and worry is the feeling of moral disengagement some nations seem to have toward NATO."

In February 1957 Britain formally advised her allies that a strained economy was forcing her to reduce her NATO commitment in Germany from 80,000 troops to 50,000. France notified NATO of a similar intention.

Aside from the economic angle, Britain said she felt the development of missiles and rockets had reduced the manpower needs of NATO.

For the French, nearly all of the nation's first line troops are committed to the suppression of the Algerian rebellion. Once France had five divisions in the NATO shield, now she has two — neither at full strength, according to an American source.

BISSAU, Portuguese Guinea (UPI) — Seven dockworkers were killed here Wednesday in a clash with police who were attempting to break up a native meeting. Five other natives and three policemen were injured.

The riot broke out in a meeting of the Bissau dockworkers union, which was protesting against the government's attempt to nationalize the port.

The rioting was the most serious since the independence of the territory from Portugal in 1963. It resulted in the death of seven people and the injury of many others.

Little Rock Sets Early School Date

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (AP)—The Little Rock School Board Tuesday night advanced the scheduled opening date for the city's high schools three weeks, then emphatically denied that fear of legislative interference with its integration plan had prompted the move.

The board voted unanimously to open the four high schools, closed for a year against integration, Aug. 12, instead of Sept. 8, when junior high and elementary schools will start their term.

Board President Everett Tucker Jr. said the board is "familiar with rumors that (Gov. Orval E.) Faubus might call the Legislature into session."

But those rumors had nothing to do with this decision, Tucker said. "The board felt these students, who have been out of the public school system for a year, needed additional time to prepare for resuming their studies."

The new opening date was proposed in a motion by Ted Lamb, one of three board members who openly oppose Faubus' school policies. The motion was adopted, without discussion, after Supt. Terrell Powell had assured the board schools could be ready for opening by the new date.

Faubus, who called a special session in 1958 to obtain passage of laws which enabled him to close the schools against integration last fall, was out of the city and unavailable for comment.

But he has been critical of the board's plan to assign six Negroes to two once-white schools and has hinted the Legislature might be called to prevent it. A federal court struck down the 1958 school closing law last June.
