

Fort Klamath School Ready

Fort Klamath Elementary Grade School will open this fall on September 9 with Mrs. Frank Strahan again teaching the first, second and third grades, and Mrs. Hollis Kizer fourth, fifth and sixth grades.

Enrollment last fall numbered 31 pupils, and is expected to be about the same this year. Of the 31 children, Mrs. Strahan had 14 in her class, and Mrs. Kizer the 17 older pupils.

Present members of the Fort Klamath school board include Mrs. Richard H. Wilson, chairman; Mrs. Gene A. Page and Elmore Nicholson.

Opening of this fall's term will mark the beginning of Mrs. Strahan's 16th consecutive year as teacher in the Fort Klamath School. Until two years ago, she was the only teacher employed, and taught her pupils, then only the first five grades, in one room.

In 1937, Mrs. Kizer was added

to the staff and the sixth grade was added to the two-room school. Pupils above the sixth grade attend school in Chiloquin, traveling by county school bus.

Mrs. Kizer is the former Maxine Loosley, native of Fort Klamath and a daughter of Mrs. Willeka R. Loosley and the late Raymond S. Loosley. Loosley was a member of one of the earliest pioneer families to homestead in the Wood River Valley.

Mr. and Mrs. Kizer have three children, and live at the Loosley ranch south of Fort Klamath, where he has been manager since

the death of Mr. Loosley two years ago.

In addition to their regular teaching duties, Mrs. Strahan and Mrs. Kizer annually plan extracurricular activities, including field trips and parties for their students. Each Christmas season, the program during the annual community Christmas tree event held in the Fort Klamath Community Methodist Church has as its main feature the presentation of their pupils in skits and short plays.

Before 1937 Mrs. Strahan carried out these activities by herself, and since has been assisted by Mrs. Kizer.
