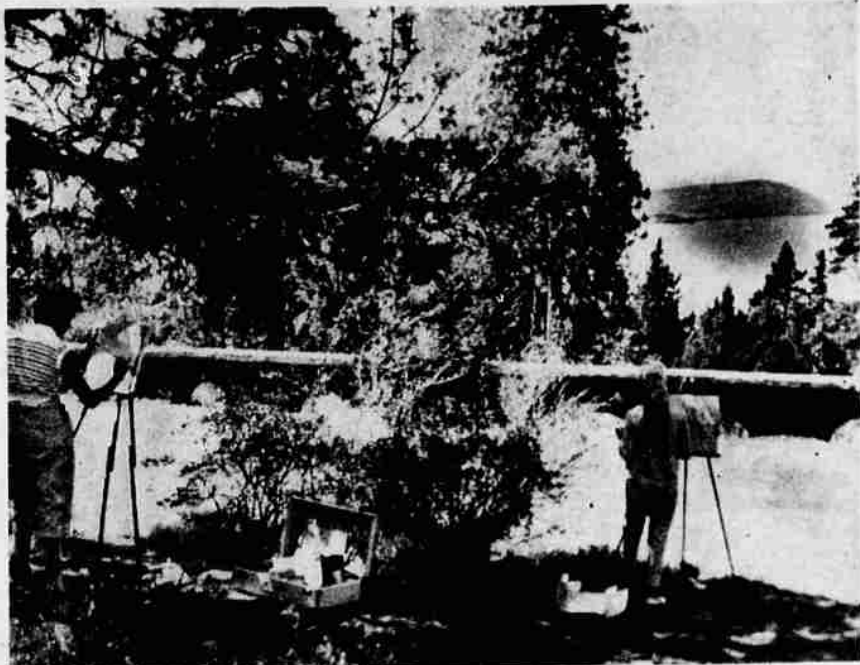
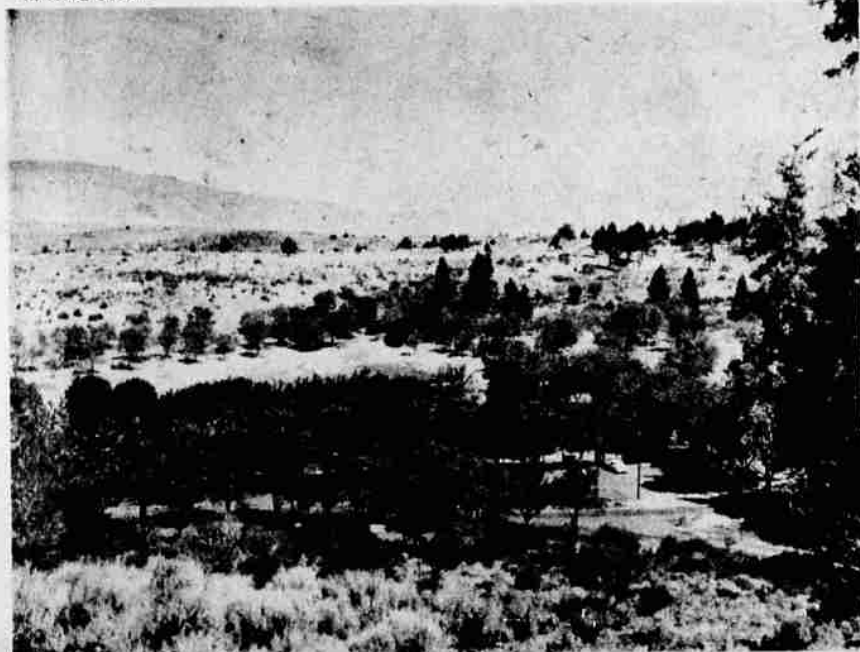
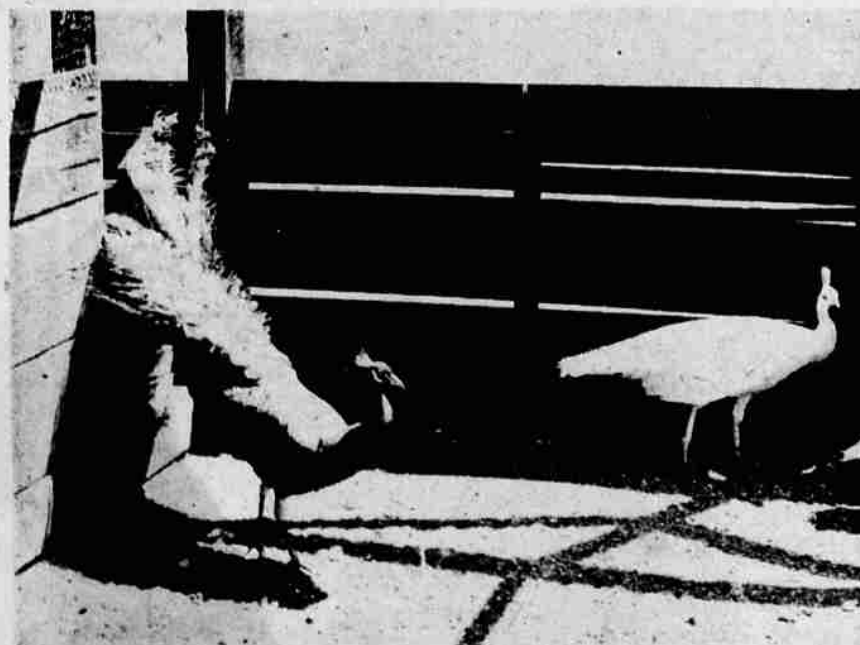

Moore Park Provides Cool Spot For Family Picnic; Also Offers Animal Show

Moore Park is getting the heaviest use this year in its history. Facilities are operating at near full capacity and the crowds still keep coming.

Caretaker Al Knowles reports more rescheduled picnics than in previous years and says that the drop-in trade at the picnic facilities is heavy. "Some people come out in the morning and stay all day," he says.

Hot weather is perhaps one reason for the exceptionally heavy use. The 435-acre park is, however, one of the prettiest anywhere in the state and is unusually well equipped for a park in a town of this size.

If present plans mature there

will be even more attractions added in the not-too-distant future. One important step is already underway on the lake frontage where present swamp land will be filled in to provide additional parking for cars and boat trailers adjacent to the launching ramp. In addition to the parking it is planned to provide grassy picnic areas for the boaters using the area.

Much improvement and expansion of present facilities is also in the planning stage.

But for the moment we can heartily recommend Moore Park for a pleasant outing. The accompanying pictures show a few of the parks scenic and recreational facilities as well as some of the animal exhibits—always a thrill for the youngsters.
