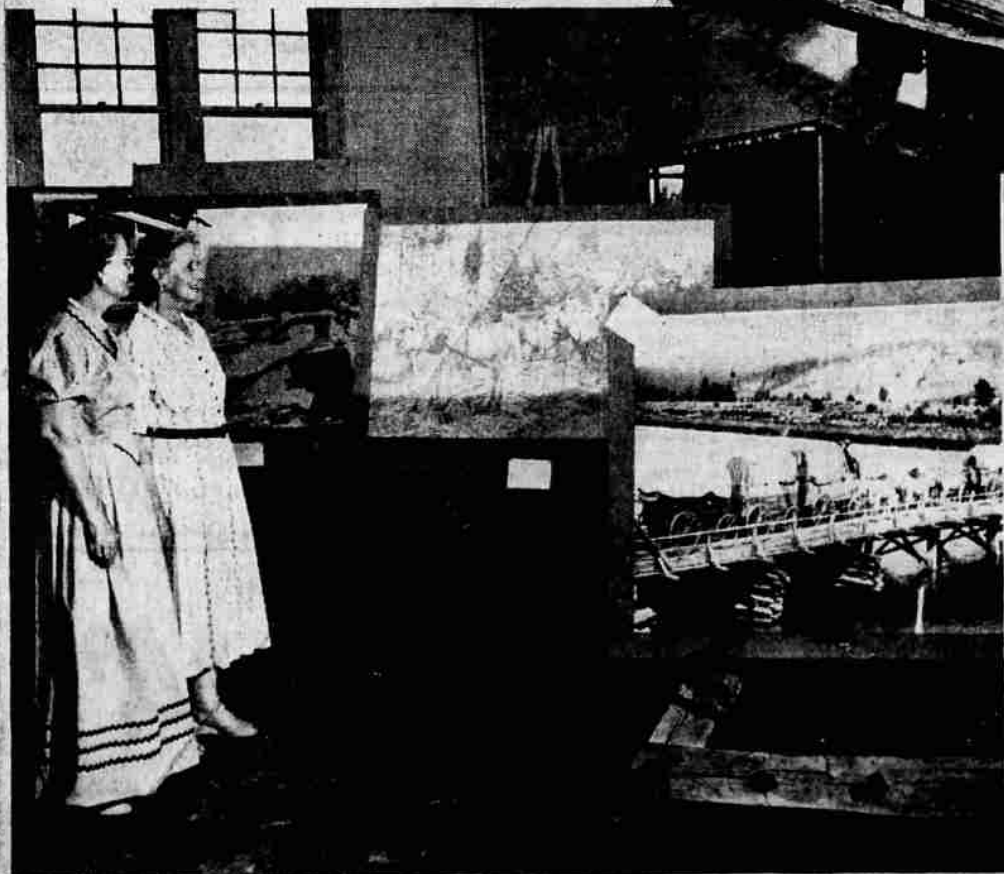
A SHADOW BOX framing the bouquet arranged by Mrs. B. L. Volk of Northside Club captured first place in the Treasured Tradition class.
