

### Damage Suit Seeks \$6,200

A civil suit on file in the county clerk's office maintains that a salesman hired to help establish a business in Lakeview failed to do so.

The suit was brought by Owen E. Moore against Ronald J. Schill. Moore maintains that Schill promised to help him establish a sewing machine and appliance sales and service in business, to provide needed equipment, and to

assist him for two weeks in return for payment of \$1,400.

Moore said the agreement was made in August 1958, but that Schill did not deliver parts and accessories as promised and in four months spent only four days with the business.

Moore seeks \$1,200 general damages and \$5,000 exemplary damages.

CIUDAD TRUJILLO, Dominican Republic (AP) — Fidel Castro's story of the capture of an arms-laden plane has been described as "one of the greatest swindles ever perpetrated on public opinion in the Americas."

Col. John Abbes Garcia, Dominican army intelligence chief, said Sunday the story is full of contradictions.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — Suzanne Ector squalled into this world 10 days ahead of time and 9,000 feet over Missouri Sunday.

Mrs. Hugh Ector, 27, of Argenta, B.C., Canada, gave birth to the 8-pound, 4-ounce girl in an airliner with the stewardess and two passengers as midwives.

Mother and daughter were taken to a Memphis hospital after the Delta Air Lines plane landed here and are doing fine.

Mrs. Ector was en route to visit her parents at Sylva, Miss. She fell the first faint labor pains at Chicago, but figured she would reach Jackson, Miss., in time. She was wrong.

### Welfare Aide Said Suicide

BERKELEY (UPI) — The body of a suicide victim was found early Sunday in the garage of her home—less than 12 hours after she was married.

The dead woman was Mrs. Martha Newton Williams, 36, Berkeley, an employee of the Alameda County Welfare Department.

The body was found by her husband, Louis F. Williams, 35, at about 5:30 a.m. when he recovered from a drinking spree which followed the wedding in the bride's home Saturday.

Police said Mrs. Williams had extended a vacuum cleaner hose from the exhaust of her car, where she was found. A note left on the car seat said:

"Sorry, I couldn't get this ring off, but I tried to."

Friends of the victim told police she had been seeking psychiatric aid.

### Test Rocket Series Opens

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States launched the first in a series of new Nike-Asp research rockets today. It left a yellow-orange cloud that was visible over much of the Eastern seaboard.

The rocket was fired from the National Aeronautics and Space Administration station at Wallops Island on Virginia's Eastern Shore and emitted a 100-mile sodium vapor trail beginning at an altitude of about 30 miles. It was topped by the large cloud that was yellow-orange in color.

NASA said the rocket had two objectives:

1. To determine wind direction and velocity over the wide range covered by the trail and cloud.
2. To measure diffusion or the rate at which matter spreads out in the upper atmosphere.

Weather bureaus from New York to Virginia had received telephone calls early this morning from people who had spotted the strange cloud. The rocket was launched at 5:18 a.m. and its trail and cloud were visible about 30 minutes.

NASA cameras on the ground tracked the vapor. The data will be collected by the Geophysics Corp. of America and turned over to the space agency.

The yellow color of the giant flare is characteristic of burning sodium. It was set off by a thermite device when the rocket reached an altitude of about 50 miles.

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — Charles Cozzens, 29, remained in critical condition at San Francisco General Hospital today with wounds suffered when he was gunned down by a berserk sniper here Saturday.

The sniper, Thomas Gutierrez, 22, was subdued by police after he carried on a gun battle from a rooftop. He was held on three counts of suspicion of assault with intent to commit murder.

Cozzens, an ambulance steward, was struck by one of the sniper's bullets as he ran to the aid of another passer-by who had been wounded slightly.

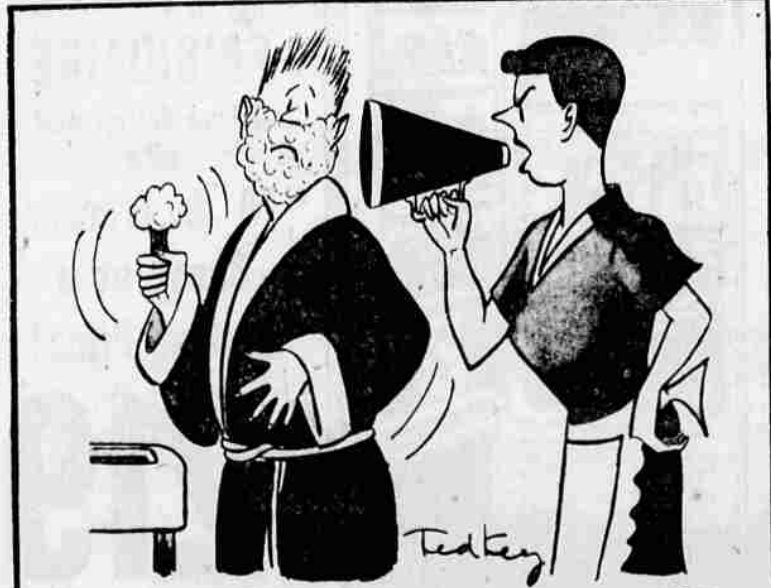
