Modoc Scout Signs Up For Jamboree

Eagle Scout John Foster was the first in Modoc Council to sign up for the 1960 Boy Scout Jamboree to be held next July in Colorado Springs.

He will be one of an expected 50,000 boys and leaders from the nation and one of the hoped-for 148 boys from the council to attend.

Foster, 14, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Marion W. Foster, 172 Dahlia Street. He is a member of Sacred Heart Parish Troop 16.

Information concerning the two-week session, July 22 through 28, is being forwarded to each unit in the Modoc Council. Harold Ashley said, He is chairman of the council's Jamboree Committee.

He says he hopes each unit will sponsor at least one trip to the jamboree. Ashley would like to see an especially big turnout because the jamboree will be a part of the scouts' 50th anniversary.

The local representation will travel together. Those traveling will visit Reno, Hoover Dam, Grand Canyon and Mesa Verde and Yellowstone National Parks. They will also take side trips from Colorado Springs.

Delegates must be at least 12 years of age by the first of next year. They must satisfy the Jamboree Committee that they each have at least 10 days and 10 nights of camping experience.

They must have attained first class rank. Explorer Scouts must have been members of that scouting branch at least three months by next July 15, or they must have transferred from a Boy Scout troop.
