struction if they are hostile. In addition to being a long-range interceptor, the F-101B has exceptional "climb" performance and operates at extremely high altitudes. The F-101B's potent firepower, rockets and Falcon missiles, combined with its all-weather radar and extreme combat radius, provides the Air Defense Command

with its most effective weapon with which to defend our American skies in the event of a sneak attack by a foreign power.

The Voodoo interceptor is capable of in-flight refueling and employs a tricycle landing gear and hydraulically operated retractable speed brakes in the aft fuselage section.

The F-101B also is equipped with a parachute—a parachute stored in the tail section compartment—which may be released by the pilot to reduce the landing roll.
