

KF Team Invades Lakeview

With only two meets left on the schedule, the Klamath Falls swimming team travels to Lakeview this Sunday where the host team will be aiming for its fifth straight win of the season and the visiting KF squad will be looking for its initial victory of the year.

The local team treks to Roseburg the weekend of August 27-28 for a two-day invitational meet with approximately five other clubs from around the state. This will wrap up the season for the KFers.

Just prior to the Roseburg meet, seven swimmers from Klamath will enter the Junior Olympic meet at Portland August 27 and 28. The seven will join the rest of the team at Roseburg immediately following the two-day affair.

The KF squad of approximately 25 will be entered in a total of 50 events at Lakeview, not including the diving division. Included on the roster of coach Stan Tooke's undefeated Lakeview crew are the Jarmon sisters, Sherry and Sheila, Bob Metson, Mavis Cleaver and Sherrain Arner.

Bill Rosensohn To Appear Before Boxing Grand Jury

NEW YORK (UPI) — Bill Rosensohn, who promoted the first Ingemar Johansson-Floyd Patterson bout but has since lost control of his own company, was scheduled to testify before the "boxing grand jury" today about the fight's odd promotional set-up.

Rosensohn was grilled for nearly eight hours in the office of Dist. Atty. Frank Hogan, repeating his earlier story of how he was "forced" to take in two promotional partners in order to stage the June 26 bout.

At almost the same time, Frankie Carbo, reputed underworld boss of boxing, was being questioned in the office of the State Attorney General Louis J. Kefauver, who also is investigating the odd goings-on surrounding the bout in which Johansson knocked out Patterson to win the heavy-weight crown.

It was the first appearance in the case for the dapper, smiling

Carbo, who has plenty of other legal troubles to keep him busy.

Earlier in the day Carbo, who is awaiting trial on charges of being an undercover and therefore unlicensed manager of fighters, was the target of a tax warrant filed in state Supreme Court.

The slender, sun-tanned Rosensohn, who returned from a vacation in Europe early Thursday morning, spent most of his time Thursday under questioning by Assistant Dist. Atty Francis X. Clark.

Rosensohn said he would waive immunity in testifying before the grand jury investigating underworld influence in boxing, because "I have nothing to hide."

Rosensohn flatly denied two things to reporters Thursday — that there was any question of a "fix" in the outcome of the fight itself, and that Carbo was the mysterious "Mr. X" who was present at a meeting between Ro-

Filly Threat To All-Time Winner

CHICAGO (AP) — Round Table, the all-time money winning champion of Travis Kerr, is having girl trouble.

A strapping filly from Australia, Wiggle II, wants to cut in on his earnings.

The enormous-striding 4-year-old, is given a pretty good chance of doing so in Saturday's \$100,000 added Arlington handicap at Arlington Park.

Round Table must carry his usual high weight of 132 pounds for the mile and three-sixteenths race on the grass. Wiggle II gets in at 105.

"That Australian filly is one of the best I've ever seen," says Round Table's trainer, Bill Molter. "I don't think she can beat Round Table. But when you give a runner like that 27 pounds, you can't tell."

Wiggle II, to be ridden by Dick

Barnett, took the winner's share of \$34,050 in the Arlington Matron last Saturday in beating Honey's Gem by three lengths in the 1¼ miles event. It was her first major U.S. victory after winning 15 of 26 starts in Australia and boosted her loot in two years to about \$105,806.

by, now acting as her groom. "With a 27-pound edge I see no reason why she won't beat Round Table," said the confident Godby. "I'm worried about all the other light weights in the race."

Round Table was a disappointing third in the recent Equipoise mile but never has been beaten in nine grass races in Chicago.
