the skin moisturized all day long. But in applying tinted foundation, bear in mind that it should go on lightly. And pick a shade that's close to your own natural skin tones. Otherwise, what you'll get will be a rose-tinted face and neck in sharp contrast to white arms and hands.

This defeats the very purpose you had in using the foundation: a natural, glowing look. It creates an enameled, artificial look that's as dated as high-button shoes.

Don't regard a tinted foundation as a cover-up for blemishes either. This is a matter to be handled separately and not to be coated over with cosmetics.

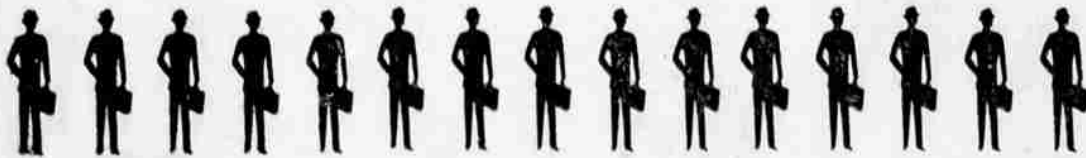

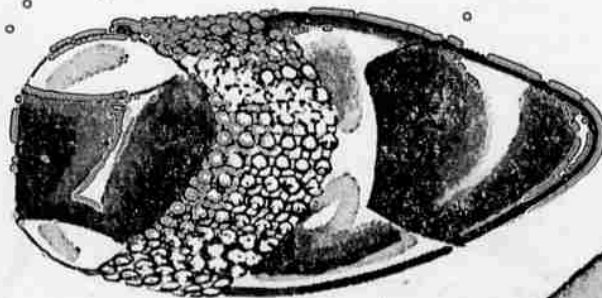
