WASHINGTON (UPI) — Here are the highlights of the life of Gen. George C. Marshall:

Dec. 31, 1880 — Born, Uniontown, Pa.

1891 — Graduated, Virginia Military Institute.

Feb. 2, 1901 — Commissioned second lieutenant, 30th Infantry.

Feb. 11, 1902 — Married Elizabeth Carter Coles (died 1927).

1917-1919 — With American Expeditionary Force in France. On general staff, 1st Division, Chief of operations, First Army, Chief of Staff, Eighth Army Corps.

1919-1924 — Aide-de-camp to General of the Armies John J. Pershing.

Oct. 15, 1920 — Married Mrs. Katherine Boyce Tupper Brown.

1933 — Chief War Plans Division, Army General Staff.

1939-1945 — Army chief of staff.

1945-1946 — President Truman's special envoy to China.

June 5, 1947 — Announced Marshall Plan.

1947-1949 — Secretary of State.

1950-1951 — Defense Secretary.

1953 — Chairman, U. S. delegation to coronation of Queen Elizabeth.

Oct. 30, 1953 — Awarded Nobel Peace Prize.

Jan. 15, 1959 — Suffered brain aneurysm at Pinehurst, N. C.

Feb. 17, 1959 — Had stroke at Ft. Bragg, N. C.

Oct. 16, 1959 — Died at Walter Reed Army Hospital, Washington.

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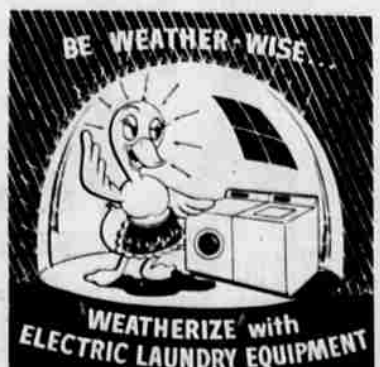
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
