Crew Finds Man's Body

PORTLAND (AP) — Workmen clearing away bushes at the east end of the Broadway Bridge in Portland Tuesday uncovered the remains of a man.

Deputy coroner Paul Haslinger said he had been dead at least eight months.

It has been about that long since an unidentified junk collector who was a familiar figure on the waterfront was last seen.

Haslinger said the bones found were the legs and lower trunk of a man. With them were a dental plate, two pairs of glasses and a rotted pair of shoes, and a decomposed wallet containing a \$10 bill.

Nearby were some clothes, most of which were in fairly good condition.

The wallet was sent to the FBI laboratory in Washington, D.C., in the hope it can aid in establishing identity.

The five are: (1) The continuing imbalance between farm and nonfarm income, both personal and in total; (2) the rural poverty issues concerning mainly low-income farmers; (3) the questions as to how the incomes of producers of livestock products can be stabilized at reasonable levels; (4) issues regarding the methods of disposing of surpluses with more discussion of how these surpluses can be managed in the interest of national defense and free world stability; (5) the problem of how to avoid continuous production of surpluses.

Allen foresees a shift in policy issues from the historic attention to wheat, cotton, rice and tobacco to the feed grain - livestock problems. Reasons are the rapidly accumulating surplus of feed grains and the economic pressure to convert this feed into livestock products. Coupled with this is the cyclical nature of livestock production. Efforts will be made to find suitable means of stabilizing income from livestock products.

MAC EXPRESSES REGRET

Blood Supply Shortage Told

PORTLAND (AP) — A critical shortage in blood supplies for parts of Oregon and Washington was reported by the Red Cross Tuesday.

It said its Portland blood center was down to two pints of Type-O negative and three pints of the relatively common Type-O positive. The center provides blood for 34 Western Oregon and Western Washington hospitals.

Gene Slick, assistant administrator of the Northwest Blood Center, said some field offices have called for emergency donors. Slick reported that the shortage has resulted in postponement of some non-emergency surgeries. Drawings are to be held at Portland, Sweet Home and Fort Lewis, and Slick said there is hope that the supply will increase substantially in the next few days.

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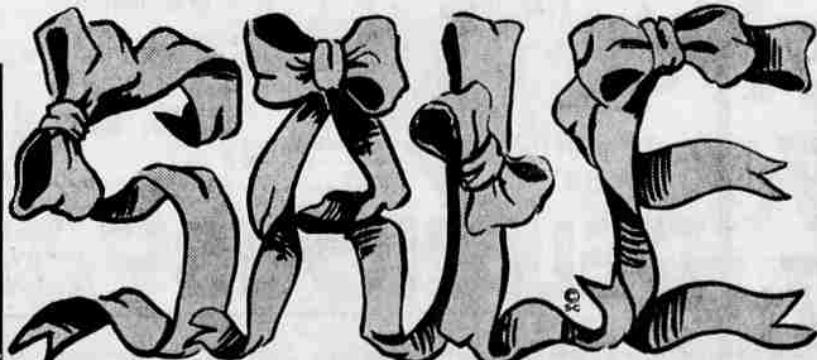
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Role Revealed As FBI Spy

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — A 42-year-old housewife told a congressional investigating subcommittee Tuesday she spent 15 years as an FBI undercover agent spying on Communist members employed in the Southern California aircraft industry.

Mrs. Moleselle Clinger made her disclosure at the opening of a three-day hearing by the House Un-American Activities subcommittee.

Mrs. Clinger said her principal job as a Communist Party member was to infiltrate the Douglas Aircraft plant in Santa Monica, Calif., and get as many members there as she could.

"I was asked to supply the names of engineers and technicians whom I considered to be 'liberal,'" she said.

In turn, she reported to the FBI at least once a week to report on her activities as a Communist, she said.
