

## 'Gutty' Youth Sets Return To School

CHICAGO (AP)—Ronald Frazer has wanted to be a doctor for as long as he can remember.

With the years of pre-med study and the many rejections from crowded medical schools it was a long struggle. But on Sept. 28 the 23-year-old Flushing, N.Y., student entered Chicago Medical School, seemingly on the last leg of a lifelong dream.

A week ago on the West Side a vicious, senseless blow on the head may have brought Ronald's plans and hopes to a stunning halt.

He awoke in the University of Illinois hospital, his skull smashed and his left side paralyzed. He is regaining the use of his leg but faces the possibility that his left arm may swing uselessly at his side for the rest of his life. Ronald is left handed.

"I was just walking along, going to lunch," he recalled Wednesday. "This fellow came up to me and said 'are you with that guy?' I still don't know what he was talking about. He had a crowbar in his hand but I didn't think he would use it. I said 'no' and walked away. He hit me—once. That's all I remember."

A burly, part-time car washer, Ernest Le Grone, has admitted the attack and said it was a case of mistaken identity. Le Grone, a Negro, told police he was drunk.

Faced with the bleak possibility that he may never use his arm Ronald said: "I couldn't be a surgeon without a left arm. But I still could be a general practitioner."

As to his plans when he is released from the hospital Ronald declared, "I'm going right back to Chicago Medical School. I fought too hard to get there to give it up now."

Le Grone appeared in Felony Court Wednesday on a charge of assault with a deadly weapon. His case was continued to Nov. 20.

## 2 Cities Ask More Money As League Ends Conclave

PORTLAND (AP)—The League of Oregon Cities wound up its annual convention here Wednesday with the adoption of five resolutions, two of which asked more money for cities. One called for a larger share of state liquor revenues for cities. The cities now get 10 per cent. They will ask the next session of the Legislature to increase that to 15 per cent. Another urged a study to determine if cities can derive revenues from federal land sales. Other resolutions asked greater use of annexation in solving fringe area problems and establishment of a special branch of the Oregon Highway Commission to deal with city problems.
