

New Summit Timetable Mullied By U.S. Chiefs

WASHINGTON (AP)—U.S. officials are talking about a new summit conference timetable now that French President Charles de Gaulle has slowed the rush to negotiate with Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev.

At the moment the outlook, as State Department authorities see it, is this:

1. A Western summit meeting in early December just before the scheduled session of NATO foreign ministers opening Dec. 15. This would bring together President Eisenhower, De Gaulle, British Prime Minister Harold Macmillan and West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer.

2. An East-West summit conference at Geneva probably in March although present speculation also includes February and April as possible meeting months.

The Geneva session would bring together Khrushchev, Eisenhower, Macmillan and De Gaulle.

Between these two heads of government meetings there would be time for detailed planning of Germany, disarmament questions and other issues which the East-West negotiations may take up.

In the meantime, some further development of East-West understanding may result from the projected visit to France of Khrushchev for talks with De Gaulle. These talks presumably will be similar in nature to his Camp David discussions with President Eisenhower last month.

Eisenhower told a news conference at Augusta, Ga., Thursday that he favored an East-West summit meeting by the end of this year but made clear he had not insisted on it. At one point, it is understood, Dec. 7 was suggested to Macmillan and De Gaulle as a target date.

Macmillan wanted the session as soon as possible. But De Gaulle insisted in correspondence with the President and Prime Minister that there must be very careful preparations of Western policies so that the three would deal with Khrushchev from common positions. The French government said it favored an East-West meeting next spring.

There is considerable speculation here that De Gaulle may also have had other considerations in mind. He may have wanted to arrange the Khrushchev visit to France prior to formal East-West negotiations. He may also have wanted more time in which to increase French prestige by exploding a nuclear weapons device in the Sahara Desert.

Some diplomats say he may also hope to win an improvement in the Algerian situation.

Officials here said the United States could not insist on having a meeting with Khrushchev this year in view of De Gaulle's opposition. President Eisenhower's cardinal concern in this respect is to obtain the maximum degree of harmony among Allied leaders on all questions involving their relations with Khrushchev. This includes the timing of a summit conference.

Revolt In Red Satellite Marks Third Anniversary

WASHINGTON (AP)—On this third anniversary of the tragic Hungarian revolution, the U.S. government says it "shall live in history as the symbol of a people's sacrifice in the cause of independence and freedom."

The State Department declaration said Americans "today remember and honor the Hungarian patriots who died in this struggle and those who, today, must live under a system which has been imposed upon them."

Unusually outspoken, the statement said the Hungarian people rebelled "in a spontaneous and valiant effort to achieve their long standing aspirations for a government which would be free of foreign domination."

"This effort failed in the face of ruthless Soviet military intervention."

In a report also timed to coincide with the third anniversary of the 1956 uprising, the House Un-American Activities committee said Hungarians are losing all hope of throwing off the Soviet yoke of oppression.

The report was based on interviews by committee staffers with Joseph Kovago, former mayor of Budapest, and Gen. Bela Kiraly, former commander of the Hungarian Freedom Fighters.

Both men, now in exile in this country, said you can't do business with Nikita Khrushchev. The committee's interviews were conducted Sept. 19, shortly before the Soviet Premier visited the United States.

Kovago said: "I think that Khrushchev is the best disciple of Machiavelli because if his own

interest dictates it, he will kill. While he finds it useful, he will smile, will kiss children, will shake hands and show a good face."

Kovago said the Hungarian people are now "in an apathy of despair."

"The new wave of terror which took place in Hungary after the revolution is increasing, and the complete control by the Soviet Union of the country is so striking and so clear to every Hungarian that the people are gradually losing their hope of regaining freedom."

Kiraly added, "It means that Hungary today is a nationwide prison, imprisoned by Khrushchev's army units."

Peaceful coexistence with the Soviet Union, Kiraly said, is a dreadful fraud.

In another development, the State Department officially notified the Red regime in Hungary it sees no need for high level negotiations to settle issues between the two countries.

The issues include such things as travel restrictions on diplomats in the two countries, "obstruction to the work of local employees," and exit visas for Hungarians whose families fled Hungary after the uprising, the department said.

AFL-CIO President George Meany in another statement said "the free world dare not forget Hungary." He urged that the

Spokane Man To Buy Bull

SEATTLE (AP)—"That bull," Tom O'Loughlin stormed Thursday, "must not die!"

O'Loughlin was completing arrangements to purchase Brook Mandore, the sweetest bull since Ferdinand when he learned the laws of the United States won't let the pretty Ayrshire come to this country.

"I'll buy him and ship him to Ireland for pasture. There aren't any laws against pretty bulls in Ireland, are there?"

O'Loughlin got into the Ayrshire act because he manages heavy-weight prize fighter Terry Lewis of Spokane, who has a tender heart. When he read that Brook Mandore was ordered destroyed because he was too pretty, Lewis vowed to buy the bull. It was to be a present for his father, Kenneth Lewis, who has a small farm near Leeds, Iowa.

Now the U.S. Department of Agriculture says the law bars importation of cattle from areas where foot-and-mouth disease exists. Britain is one of the areas. Only congressional action could get Brook Mandore into the country—and Congress won't meet again until January.

O'Loughlin said he could not disclose the purchase price as "the deal hasn't been completed yet."

He got through to owner William Titcomb by telephone Wednesday and learned that other offers had come from Miami and Washington, D. C.

In the national capital Norman Bennett, president of a store, wanted Brook Mandore for a children's show. Mrs. Geraldine Pelton of Miami wanted to fly the bull to the Florida metropolis and place him in a children's zoo.
