Chivalry Said Anti-Female

CLEVELAND, Ohio (UPI) — Chances are that a man who takes his hat off when a woman enters an elevator really regards women as inferior.

That is the report of two psychologists who investigated the theory that chivalry usually is a subtle form of male domination.

Dr. Eugene B. Nadler, assistant professor of Engineering Administration at Case Institute of Technology here, and Dr. William R. Morrow of the Fulton, Mo., State Hospital, surveyed the attitudes of several groups of male college students by means of questionnaires.

One questionnaire asked the students to agree or disagree with statements that women are inferior and should be dominated. The second questionnaire concerned chivalry, asking such questions as whether a "gentleman should allow the lady to pay the check, buy the tickets, or pay the taxi."

Nadler and Morrow said the results showed in general that men who agreed that women are inferior also tended to favor such gestures as taking off one's hat in an elevator.

A third set of questions to measure racial prejudice and anti-democratic attitudes in general showed that it usually is the man who is biased, narrow-minded and an advocate of force to settle issues who has this contempt for women.

SPRINGFIELD, Ill. (UPI)—Hal lie H. Holt didn't get discouraged when publishers rejected his manuscripts. He learned the printing trade and published his books himself.

Holt says that printing has now become as much a part of his life as writing and that his books are finally being bought and read.

The elderly printer-writer published his first book in 1955. It was entitled "Young Pioneers," a story about hunting and camping aimed at Boy Scouts. Holt printed 300 copies and sold 250 of them at \$2.50 apiece.

Two years later, he published a 16-page booklet about Abraham Lincoln which still is being sold by souvenir shops near the Lincoln home here.

He turned out his latest book, "The Mysteries of Existence," several months ago. In 113 pages, he explains his ideas on life, death and life after death.

Here's Who Can Peek:

CHICAGO (UPI)—How private is your income tax return?

The Commerce Clearing House, a tax and business law reporting firm, lists some of the private individuals who, with proper authority, may scrutinize your return:

—Either spouse, in case of a joint return.

—Receiver or trustee in bankruptcy holding the taxpayer's property.

—An heir, testamentary beneficiary or legal representative of a deceased taxpayer.

—Defendant in a personal injury suit where the plaintiff's income tax return indicates the extent of damages suffered.

The U.S. Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare, for Social Security administration purposes.
