Former Wife Rips Actor

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Actor Sterling Hayden's former wife charges that he endangered the lives of his four children for the sake of money when he took them on a South Seas voyage in his yacht.

Mrs. Betty Ann Hayden, 36, is trying to get custody of the children.

Wednesday she charged in Superior Court the 42-year-old actor flouted court orders when he sailed away on his schooner Wanderer nine months ago with their children, Christian, 10, Thor, 9, Gretchen, 8, and Matthew, 6.

She said a court ordered Hayden not to remove the children from California without her consent when it gave him custody in 1955. She charged further that Hayden put the children in peril for monetary gain to be realized from films made on the voyage.

A hearing on her petition was set for next Monday.

Hayden and the children have not returned from Tahiti.

Nikita Visit Hit By Cleric

TACOMA, Wash. (AP) — A churchman says Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev's visit to the United States was the "greatest mistake our honored president has made."

Dr. Carl McIntire, Collinswood, N.J., president of the International Council of Christian Churches, said Wednesday President Eisenhower should scuttle the Soviet-United States exchange program. He said only the Soviets benefitted.

Dr. McIntire made the remarks in a speech to the 18th annual convention of the American Council of Christian Churches here. The council represents 1½ million Protestants in 15 denominations.

Missile Boss To Take Post

WASHINGTON, (AP) — Maj. Gen. August Schomburg has been named to succeed Maj. Gen. John B. Medaris as head of the Army's Missile Command.

Medaris is retiring Jan. 31 as chief of the Army rocket team at Huntsville, Ala. With Dr. Werner von Braun heading its scientific group, this team was responsible for launching the United States' first earth satellite, its first solar satellite, and developing the 1,500-mile range Jupiter ballistic missile.

Schomburg, 51, was named to the post Tuesday. He is now deputy chief of ordnance for the Army. Previously he was assistant chief for research and development.

Medaris has denied his resignation was prompted by dissatisfaction over the way the Army has handled rocket development at Huntsville, particularly the huge Saturn program.

But Medaris' action forced an administration review of the problem. As a result Saturn, a space rocket that will develop 1½ million pounds of thrust, has been taken from the Army and placed under the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

School Chief Convicted

SEATTLE, Wash. (AP) — The 60-year-old operator of a small military academy here, accused of mistreating cadets, has been convicted of contributing to the delinquency of minors.

Thomas H. Hopkins was found guilty Tuesday night by a six-man Justice Court jury, which fined him \$500 and costs. Mrs. Hopkins, 52, was acquitted of the same charge.

Mr. and Mrs. Hopkins will go on trial again Monday on charges of third-degree assault involving the alleged mistreatment of cadets.

Hopkins also faces a second-degree assault charge over an incident with the father of one cadet.

Witnesses testified Hopkins ordered cadets to punish fellow students by hitting them or throwing water on them.

Hopkins' lawyer, who said he would appeal, told the jury, "Twenty-five years ago this entire affair would have been passed off with a shrug and a remark of 'spare the rod and spoil the child.'"

Negligence Suit Cites Bing's Wife

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Bing Crosby's wife, actress Kathy Grant, is accused of negligent driving in a \$50,000 damage suit filed by a retired businessman.

Herman S. Magad, 60, charges in a Superior Court action brought Wednesday that Miss Grant's auto struck a car in which he was riding last Nov. 12 in Hollywood. Magad said he suffered a neck injury and a cut on his chin. Crosby Enterprises, Inc., is named codefendant.

Iceland Party Loses Ground

REYKJAVIK, Iceland (AP) — Iceland's pro-American Conservatives—the Independence party—lost ground in Sunday's general elections but a pro-Western coalition government appears likely.

The Conservatives' probable choice of a partner for the next four years are the Social Democrats (moderate Socialists), whose party chairman, Emil Jonsson, has headed a caretaker government for the past 10 months.

The Conservatives, with 20 seats in the old Parliament, had hoped

to win most of the eight additional seats in the expanded 60-member body. They got only 4, giving them a total of 24.

The Communists picked up 3 seats, boosting their total to 10, while the Social Democrats also gained 3 for a total of 9.

FALSE ALARM PORTLAND (AP) — Police searched 1,600 lockers at Grant High School here Tuesday after the custodian got a call saying a bomb was in one of them. No explosives were found.

The isolationist Progressive ignored the presence of the 6,000-man American radar base at Keflavik—a controversial issue in the past.
