

## A Cup Of Honey

With October's bright gold weather, as the poet phrased it, and a container of extracted honey on the storage shelf or a pound in the cupboard, homemakers can have "Honey Day" even before Honey Week. The latter started the 26th of October and continues through October 31. With bountiful supplies of this delicious nectar in the markets now, the family's menu-planner can have a successful morning in her colorful kitchen.

It is fun and satisfaction to see what the homemaker can do with one cup of honey. Starting with breakfast, Honey Butter helps sweeten that meal and increases one's energy. Toast, hot breads, or waffles are all improved with it as a spread. Cream  $\frac{1}{4}$  cup butter well. Add  $\frac{1}{4}$  cup of honey gradually. Beat thoroughly. Chill until firm.

Fruit filling for sandwiches are a treat for the school or office lunch box or the lunch at home. It requires  $\frac{1}{4}$  cup each dried prunes, dates, figs and orange peel; 1 tablespoon candied ginger;  $\frac{1}{4}$  cup honey. Chop fruit and blend with honey. Serve between slices of buttered bread.

Honey Custard is delicious as the after school snack, dessert at dinner or to serve during TV hour. Beat five eggs just long enough to mix yolk and white, add  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup of honey;  $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon cinnamon and  $\frac{1}{4}$  teaspoon salt. Add 1 quart of scalded milk slowly. Pour mixture into buttered custard cups and place in a shallow pan of water. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees) until a knife inserted in center of custard comes out clean, or about 35 minutes. Cool and serve on glass plates with custard surrounded by sliced fresh strawberries, sliced peaches, or raspberries when in season.

## Olive Cheese Pie

Meatless entrees that satisfy the inner man aren't always easy to achieve. Yet meatless entrees are more than welcome every now and then. Ripe olives, rich with fruit oil, play no small part in making this an elegant dish.

### OLIVE CHEESE PIE

- $\frac{3}{4}$  cup ripe olives
- 3 eggs
- 2 cups milk
- 1 teaspoon salt
- $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon dry mustard
- $\frac{1}{4}$  teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- Dash black pepper
- Dash cayenne pepper
- 1 tablespoon instant minced onion
- 2 cups grated cheese

(packed)  
Pastry for single 9 - inch crust

Cut olives into large pieces. Beat eggs lightly; blend in milk, seasonings and onion. Stir in olives and cheese. Turn into pastry-lined pie pan. Bake in very hot oven (450 degrees) 15 minutes; reduce heat to slow (350 degrees) and bake 30 to 40 minutes, until egg mixture is set.

Makes six to eight servings.

Here are the ingredients:

- 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ -to-3-pound Oregon Fryer, cut up
- 1 package dry onion soup
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup brown rice (long cooking)
- 1 can cream of chicken soup
- Garlic salt

Sprinkle dry onion soup in bottom of baking dish. Then sprinkle rice on top of the dry onion soup. Cover with a layer of chicken pieces. Dilute chicken soup according to directions on the can. Pour soup over all the ingredients. Season with garlic salt. Bake in 350-degree oven for one hour or until chicken pieces are tender.
